





He was a most excellent mathematician, and left many MSS., which are frequently quoted by other authors, and mentioned as having been deposited in the Bibliotheca Alleniana. Sir Thomas Chaloner, of London, Knt., excelled as a statesman, soldier, and poet, born in London, circu-1515, educated at Oxford and Cambridge; he was introduced at the court of Henry 8, who sent him abroad in the retinue of Sir Henry Knevett, as ambassador to the illustrious Charles 5, and he attended that monarch in the fatal expedition to Algiers. On his return to England, he was appointed first clerk of the Council, and was knighted by Protector Somerset, atMusselborough Field, 1547, ambassador to Ferdinand 1, temp. Q. Eliz., and was accredited to the court of Spain, in 1561, ob. 1565, buried in St. Paul's.

Sir Thomas Chaloner, of Steeple Claydon, co. Bucks, and of Guisborough, co. York, although inconsiderable as a poet, attained to some eminence as a naturalist. Being young at the time of his father's death, Lord Chancellor Burleigh sent him to St. Paul's School, and afterwards to Oxford, where, like his accomplished father, he discovered an extraordinary passion for Latin and English poetry; knighted in 1591. He constantly attended Prince Henry, to whom he was appointed Governor by James 1, and when his royal pupil visited Oxford was honoured with the degree of M.A. He died 18 November, 1615, aged 51, and was buried in the chancel of Chiswick church, co. Middlesex.




Pedigree of Constable, of Flambrough, etc.



Pedigree of Dawnay, of Baldersby Park.



The family of Fawell or Favell were settled in very early times in Yorkshire and Northampton; in the latter county at Walcot, and afterwards at Weston, called Weston Favell from this family. They were lords of the manor of Weston from the time of Henry 3 to that of Edward 3, when the property passed to the Griffins, by the marriage of Sir John Griffin, of Weston, with Elizabeth, the heiress of her brother, and daughter of John Favell, of Weston, by his wife Fine, the daughter of Geoffrey de la Mare, of Norborough. The Arms of the Favells of Weston were-Argent, a bend within a bordure gules bezantée.

The Yorkshire family of this name were in Craven during the same reigns, and held lands in Thorolby, Stretton, Broughton, Stetton, Fearnhill in Coningley, Skipton, and Stainforth, They continued in the district, chiefly at Burnsall, down to a late period. One branch migrated in the time of Charles I to the parish of Kirby Overblows, and ultimately settled at Normanton.










Pedigree of Tuke, or Touke,

This family was settled in Nottingham soon after the Conquest, and in Derbyshire and Yorkshire as early as the reign of Edward 1. The name appears amongst the old Tenants of the Crown at Walkeringham, near to Finningley, and Awkley, on the borders of Nottinghamshire and Yorkshire, in the reigns of William Rufus, Henry 1, Stephen, and Henry 2: and at West Leke (called Jordan de Touc's Leke), in South Nottinghamshire, from the time of Henry 2 to that of Edward 1. Here the family was enfeoffed by Robert de Ferrers in the time of Henry 2, using the arms of that family, viz.:—A chevronel between three horse-shoes, which is the bearing on the seal of Sir William de Touc, of Leke, temp. Henry 3: from this family probably descended the Derbyshire branch, settled for many generations at Potlock, in that county, and lords of the manor of Synfen in the reigns of Edward 1, 2 and 3. They bore Arms:—Barry of six, sable and argent.

The chief seat of the family was at Kelham, near Newark, where, as well as in many other places in the county, they held land from the time of Richard 1 to that of Henry 6. The manor of Kelham was in their possession, held of the Honor of Tickhill, in Yorkshire, until the time of Edward 1, 1328. In the reigns of Edward 1 and 2 they had one moiety of the manor of Finningley and Awkley, in Nottinghamshire and Yorkshire, the Tukes being owners of land there during the 16th, 17th, 18th and 19th centuries, one portion of the manor passing, by the will of Thomas Tuke, of Wath, in 1810, to Thomas Tuke Smelter, of Richmond, near Sheffield. The arms of the Tukes, of Kelham, as borne by Sir Walter Touke, lord of the manor of Kelham, and of Finningley and Awkley, were Sable, billettle or, a canton ermine (vide Cotton MS., Caligula 4, 16).


Pedigree of Cuke, of Chorner, near Leeds.


Pedigree of Cuke, of Stillingsleet.
