PREFACE.

In recent years many cities and towns in this country, more especially in New England, have become interested in collecting and preserving historical data. Communities which have not been indifferent to progress in other matters have evinced a strong desire to gather the scattered threads of historic value, cherishing the hope that from the tangled skein might be evolved the story of a people's worth.

In cities and towns which possess abundance of material for civic pride, this spirit has become a settled policy and the printer's art is being freely used to perpetuate the records of the past.

For many years past, the necessity of copying and preserving in some permanent form the early records of the Town of Cambridge was evident to any person who had occasion or desire to scrutinize the original records.

That this City possesses records which have successfully survived the occurrences of two hundred and sixty years is indeed a source of congratulation, but an examination of the pages reveals the ravage of time, and the probability that in a few years practical use of these records will be impossible.

Mr. Walter W. Pike, late City Clerk, was fully cognizant of the need of preservative action, and requested of the City

Council authority to commence the work of copying and printing. This request met with a hearty response, as is hereafter recited, and the work was begun with an ardor and interest which bespoke its rapid and successful completion.

By the death of Mr. Pike, however, the task of continuing a work which had been so well begun necessarily fell upon his successor in office.

In his inaugural address, delivered January 1, 1894, His Honor, Mayor Bancroft, recommended that the expediency of publishing the old Records of Newtowne and the Town of Cambridge, together with the Records of the Proprietors of Common Lands, be considered by the City Council. Acting upon this recommendation, the matter was intrusted to the Committee on Printing for that year, — Aldermen Bleiler and James, and Councilmen Reid, Allen, and Whitmore. This Committee, believing that preservation in type of these old records of the early town was of paramount importance, and after careful deliberation, reported favorably, as the following order passed by the City Council on March 15, 1894, at its request, will show, viz.:—

"Ordered: That the City Clerk be authorized to prepare a printer's copy of the Proprietors' Records of Cambridge suitable for publication, and at an expense not exceeding the sum of five hundred dollars, the same to be charged to the appropriation for Incidental Expenses."

Under the direction of Mr. Pike, then City Clerk, the task of preparing a correct copy of the Records of the Proprietors was immediately commenced.

The printer's copy from the pages of the original record was prepared by Miss Sarah S. Jacobs of this City. Her great experience and knowledge of old town methods rendered her familiar with the demands of the work, while her intelligence and readiness in deciphering the old manuscript insured a correct translation of the original text. Entirely in sympathy with the project of printing the old records of Cambridge, the preparation of the copy, laborious and irksome though it was, has been on her part largely a labor of love, — a fact conclusively proven by a careful examination of these pages.

Besides the preparation of the printer's copy, and of the indexes, Miss Jacobs has also read and compared the pages of proof matter, — no small task when it is known that every word has been scanned in order that not a letter or punctuation-mark should differ from the original manuscript.

Before the close of the year 1894 the copy was completed, and on May 15, 1895, Mayor Bancroft approved an order of the City Council, authorizing the City Clerk to cause to be printed one thousand copies.

A contract for printing was executed with the "University Press" of this City, and the work has been steadily pushed to completion. The excellent typographical appearance of these pages is due to the foresight and skill of the members of this printing-establishment, who have suggested freely of their knowledge during the progress of the work.

The original Records of the Proprietors are contained in three volumes. The first volume embraces the period from 1634 to 1741, and contains a few detached records as late as 1808.

There is also a separate record at the end of the volume, extending from 1636 to 1697. The second volume embraces the period from 1751 to 1773. The third volume embraces the period from 1784 to 1829.

In 1841, by order of the Selectmen, a transcript of the original records was made by Rev. Lucius R. Paige, then Clerk of the Town. This copy has been of very great assistance in the compilation of the present volume, although its value as a literal transcript is diminished on account of its modern orthography.

For a clearer understanding of the scope of this work, and of the signs used in printing, the following explanatory remarks are made. It has been the intention to present in this volume all and the same information which a perusal of the manuscript would present to the reader. No attempt has been made to modernize the text, or to make corrections of any description. From page 1 to page 391, the book is a reproduction of the originals, except the introduction of the title, paging, and explanatory marks and foot-notes.

Throughout this volume the dates of the entries do not appear consecutively in all cases, but the dates are published in the exact order in which they appear in the originals. It has not been deemed advisable to place them in consecutive order, except when such order was in agreement with the original text.

The figures at the top of the pages indicate the paging of the transcript. The heavy figures enclosed in brackets represent the paging of the original book in its present condition.

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The title "Proprietors' Records" has been used, in the belief that the appearance of the book would be thereby improved.

Brackets enclosing a blank space, thus, [], signify that something is missing from, or illegible in the original. Carets, A, show that a letter or letters in a word are missing. Whenever a star, *, appears on a page it refers to a foot-note on that page.

In the original records, pages 115, 116, 158, 159, 160, 290, and 291 are blank, and no corresponding heavy figures in brackets appear in the transcript, nor is there an explanatory foot-note. Page 171 is repeated both in the original and in the copy. With these exceptions any changes from the rules herein stated have been noted in foot-notes and indicated by stars.

On page 367 is printed what is marked as page 30 of the original Volume No. 2. This placing agrees with the manuscript as it *now* exists, although there is a doubt of its correctness.

With these explanatory remarks, it is believed that an intelligent perusal of the volume is within the reach of the reader.

having two Acres for one on the Cow Comon or Rocks—the persons are these that follow—

Jacob Hill had laid out to him thirty two Acres among said small farmes for Sixteen that would have been his proportion on ye Rocks;—

Abraham Holman also had thirty two Acres amongst said farmes -

Likewise John Marrett & John wyeth had each of them thirty two Acres apiece laid out in mañer aforesaid

[178] Jason Rufsell having Bought Mr Pelhams Lott of twenty Acres in the first Division of the Rocks, hath fenced the same for his particular Improvement & before he so did, addrefsed himselfe unto the Select men according to what is exprefsed in the fifth proposition agreed on & voted by the propriet; before ye Division of said lotts, all things thereto appertaining, being attended as is enjoined in said Proposition—

William Rufsell having Bought a lott laid out to Nathan^{II} Hancock, also a lott laid out to Owen Worland, wth a lott laid out to his Mother y^e Widow Hall, he desiring to make particular Improvem^t of said land, applyed himselfe to y^e Select Men according to y^e Injunction in y^e said fifth proposition, attending all things therein required —

Also the said William Rufsell pofsefsing a Lott layd out to John Sawtle in the first division having applyed himselfe to the Select men the 7th of January 169⁴/₅ was by them Ordered that he attending the order in the 5th. Article as others do he hath the Liberty as others have in that regard, and that being done as was then ordered by thos appointed for the fame, we now give him Liberty to enclose the Same this 10th day of January 169⁴/₅:

William Munroe haveing bought of the Comon Land Ordered by the proprioters to be Sold to pay some Town debts hath bought three Accres and an halfe butted and bounded as followeth North Westerly the Land belonging to the said William Munroe, the high way Northerly, and Æast and South the Land of Phillip Russel

Sold unto John Russel five accres and an halfe of Comon Land lying neer his dwelling house, bounded with his own land North, Nathaniel Hancocks meddow Southerly: John Dixon his meddow Æaft Mr Jona: Dunster and William Russel South, and William and Jaason Russel North: And it is covenanted that the sale to this Sd Russel for ever hereafter shall allow convenient passage to the respective persons whose meddows do butt upon the Said Land, to cart away their hay, which high ways are included within the fore mentioned bounds and allowance made for the Same, and to pay for said percel of Land, one pound and nineteen Shillings in money, which is already payd to Mr

John Hastings as before on the Same account and by the Same order of the Select men

Sold unto William and Jaason Russel by the said Select men and comittee three accres of Land more or less, being bounded by Mr Shepards meddow West, the farme land North, and an high way leading to John Dixons meddow Southeast wich percell of Land is Scittuate and Lying being neer unto South west of Phillip Russels house

This first of ffebruary in the year 1695. by the order of the Selectmen, payd to Mr John Hastings Schoolmaster, three pounds, three shillings four pence, the rest that is one pound and eight pence payd Town

Memorandum. that whereas there [] spoken in the first division the 25th Lott that was Layd out to Samuel Cooper there is mention made of that Lott abutting upon comon Land South Æafternly; it is found upon perusall that there is no comon Land there, but the Land that is there, belonged to the ffollowing Lotts, or to the five following Lotts to make up their proportion

Acording to the Order of the Select men January the 7th 1694, referring to the Address of Joseph Winfhip, William Russel and Jaafon Russel, signifying their intentions to fence in some of their Lotts, lately layd out on our Rocks, agreeable to the 5th proposition agreed upon by the proprietors for division of the Same; We Whose Names are underwritten or subscribed as being appointed, did on the 10th day of the said month attend the said Service on the behalfe of the Town, and return as followeth:

William Russel possessing a Lott layd out to John Sawtle in the first division; Wee Judge may intirely be fenced and inclosed, without Incumbrance of any high way or passage forever to any Lands layd out on our Rocks

Jaafon Russel Intends the fencing of Lotts layd out to Sam^{II} Andrew, Sam^{II} Cooper and James Hubberd in the first division and to Joseph Addams part of a Lott bought of him; We also Judge and determine, that he shall leave an high way or passage on the South west two Rods wide, So far as Jonathan Remingtons Lott, in the first division, so doing hath Liberty to inclose the rest

Joseph Winship also propounded to inclose and sence a Lott Layd out to the Widdow Mitchelson, which he hath bought, We also Judge that he may So do Leaving a passage of two Rods on his South west Line, So far as the brow of the Hill (which is about thirty or fourty Rods from his North west Line) and from thence he may take into his sence his whole

Lott, the bredth of it, all these were performed by the Said persons that was appointed by the Select men upon the 10th day of the Said month the s^d year, the Names as follow

[181] There being an act of the proprietors in the town Comons bearing date May 12th 1693 wherein the select Men & others Joined with them as in said act may appeare were nominated a Committee to make Sale of some remnants of Comon lands for paymi of debts due from the Town to the school Masters, they made sale of a parcell of land lying among the farmes being all the Comon land lying between a lott of John Marrett & Phillip Cookes Farme being the whole of Comon land in ye place being Bounded with said Maretts land Northwest with oburn line North East; with said Phillip Cookes Farme South East & with that Called the Churches Farme South West web land was Sold unto Amos Marrett on Consideration of his paying five pounds six shillings in Money for the Same web was accordingly paid to satisfaction:

September the 24: 1695

Att a publick meeting of the proprietors of this Town of Cambridge orderly warned

It was defired there Should be Some perfons Chofen to Lay claime unto any prcells of Land that did, as they apprehend belong to the Town, and is thought to be encroached by Some Severall perfons, and there was then chofen John Jackfon, Joseph Winfhip and Jacob Æmsden or any two of them to Lay claime, to said prcells of Land that doe belong to the proprietors of this towne on behalfe the Town and to profecut the Same to Effect: and also voted that the proprietors of the Comon Land of said Town of Cambridge, do bear the charges that the Said John Jackfon, Joseph Winfhip, Jacob Æmfden, the Comittee then Chosen, shall be att in their Claiming, Recovering, the proprietors Rights aforefaid:

September the 24th: 1695

The Select men then viewing the high way on the South Side of the River and finding that Gershom Davis had taken in a small peell of Land by Mr Angiers farme did acknowledg it to be the Towns Land, and did pay one Shilling for the benifitt he had by it this year

Novembr the 19th: 1695

Att a Town Meeting of the proprietors: was then put to vote that the Land that is possessed by Samuel Bull Ordered him by the Comittee appointed by the Generll proprietors about the Ordering of the Laying out of the wood Lotts; the Said Land was voted by the proprietors now to be confirmed to Said Bull

Also there was then voted about 70 pole that was also ordered by the asore comittee unto the Heires of Robert Willson, was also then confirmed by vote to them

To both these votes John Jackfon being unfatisfied concerning these Votes, did defire his Diffent thereto might be entered in the Town Book

Also M^r Samuel Goffe Senr: defired the Same liberty to enter his Deffent also: to the same votes.

[182] Also November the 19th: 1695 Then voted that

Also the Same day as above John Gove did att the Same meeting disclaime the Land that was then Spoken of being about 7 acares as a wood Lott, as his own

Also the Same day the proprietors did vote that all Such persons as possess wood Lotts on the other Side Menotomic river, the Lands of said Lotts being to lye Comon for the Towns vse, shall take off all such wood upon said Land before the 4th day of ffebruary next, ensuing, and Such prsons, So possessed of wood therein and neglect to take of Such

wood within foresaid limitted time; it shall from thence forward be accounted Comon, and difposed of by the Major part of the proprietors

Also the Same day and Meeting it was Voted that what Charge John Jackson, Jofeph Winfhip and Jacob Æmsden had born in Claiming the Severall prcells of Land for the proprietors, Incroached upon by the Sundry prfons in the Town, and to defray what charge they Should be att in the prosecution of the said Land, it was voted on the affirmettive by the Said proprietors; And alfo that the Select men Shall proprieton the Same as equally as they can, upon each proprietor, and deliver the Same to the Conflable of Said Town to Collect the Same and deliver the Same to Deacon walter Haftings to pay the Said perfons their juft dues;

Alfo it was voted on the affirmative that John Watson, John Jackfon, Jeremiah Holeman and Samuel Gibson all of said Town were then chosen to run the Line between M^r Danforths Land and that that is the Towns

September the 30th: 1695

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
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












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
