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Earliest Baptist Church in Lycoming Co., Pa.

The FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH in the West Branch Valley was formed at the home of Jacob Tomb at Slate Run (Brown Twp., Lycoming Co., Pa.), and is attested to in the minutes of the Church Council as follows:

"On January 17, 1827, at the home of Jacob Tomb, on Big Pine Creek, an Ecclesiastical Council composed of Eli Gitchell from the Sullivan Church; Joseph Dingham, from Columbus and Wells Churches; Hegekiah West, from Crwell and Shesequin Churches, and Deacons Samuel Rockwell and Daniel Rogers from the Canton Churches, met with the following 18 persons;

The Council was called for the purpose of examining the fitness of the above persons and in advising them in the matter of organizing a Baptist Church. The council opened with singing and prayer. Business was then taken up. Elder H. West was elected moderator, and Deacon S. Rockwell, clerk. Next the council examined the articles of faith and covenant of those seeking to form the church, and the personal fitness of those present. Council adjourned and retired to form their decision, which was as follows: Council agrees that Elder Eli Gitchell preach the sermon and Elder West give the right hand of Fellowship.

"At the 12th session of the Northumberland Baptist Association held in Wilton in 1832 the church, with 34 members, was received as a member of the association. The right hand of fellowship was extended to Robert McMasters and Benjamin Tomb, who represented the church.

"The field of the new church was very large, geographically. It reached from the first fork of Pine Creek down to the Susquehanna River 12 miles, with places of meeting at First Forks, English's Island, Tomb's Run schoolhouse, Forge Schoolhouse, and Phelph's Mills. Then up the river as far as Lock Haven, with places of meeting on both sides the river at Chatham's Run and Wayne Township. An out-station at Granville, now Antes Fort, and another in Hippenose Valley were maintained.

"The places of worship occupied by the church were many during the first 10 years because of the scattered memberships. Meetings were held in log cabins, schoolhouses, the homes of members and friends, occasionally in barns and frequently along the banks of the river and creek.

"In 1832 the Baptists and Presbyterians built a joint house of worship in Jersey Shore. The building was erected of brick. The two churches occupied the building until 1842 when the Baptists sold their share to the Presbyterians."

There is a gap in Baptist records on Pine Creek until the following piece of rag paper found among old items of the Brown (Twp.) Baptist Church at Cedar Run, Pa. (also known as Gamble Baptist Churchyard and Congregation:



"We, the undersigned do agree to pay the amount next to our names for the purpose to furnish the Baptist House of Worship which has lately been erected in Brown Township the money to be paid to the trustees on or before the first of October. (No date - old rag paper) Probably in 1850's or before.)

The minutes of the old Brown (Twp.) Baptist Church begin Saturday, September 12, 1857. Meetings were held on 2nd Saturday of each month. A few excerpts follow - enough to show their procedure, and also the names of members and church officers that early."

"Heard the brothers and sisters relate their christian travails and trials, difficulties, hopes and pray but five came to the Covenant meeting and those who came complain of coldness and ingratitude. Closed by prayer, Hiram Hilborn, Clerk.

Sat. Oct. 11, 1857 "----- 2nd Sat. of Nov., heard from the brethren and sisters was encouraged to press forward to the prize.-Closed by Prayer. Hiram Hilborn, Clerk

-----Second Sat. in December of 1857---Resolution made and seconded we withdraw the hand of fellowship from the following persons:

"Resolved that any member absenting themselves from Covenant meeting three successive times shall be looked after by the church. Closed by Prayer. Hiram Hilborn, Clerk

"April 10, 1857 Opened by prayer-----

Bro. John Gamble appointed to visit J. Hilborn, George Watson and C. Barsley. Resolved that Brother Robert Clark visit George Riegles and his wife and A. S. Clark visit Mary Campbell.---Resolved that Bro. A. S. Clark act as church clerk for one year.-----

August 11, 1859. "Heard Mrs. and sisters tell their trials, joys, hopes, and fines in Divine life received strength therefrom.----Resolved that hand of fellowship be withdrawn from George Riegles and wife, Mary Campbell, and Josy Hilborn----" A.S. Clark, Clerk

January 15, 1859 "Covenant meeting opened by prayer--heard the brothers and sisters tell their joys, hopes and fears, received divine grace from on high" Closed by prayer. A.S. Clark, clerk

August 10, 1861 "Simon Wilcox and wife admitted by letter--the former named clerk."

January 11, 1862 "Series of meetings to be held-----"

March 8, 1862 "Met in Covenant meeting, J.D. Van Patan, Moderator. opened by prayer by moderator,---proceeded to hear minds of brethren and sisters---the months past has been a time of weeping and rejoicing and the church has been made to rejoice and Satan made to tumble quite a number has professed a hope in the Savior and we have been called to mourn the death of Father Andrew Gamble, which we feel and do sympathize with them that mourn, and church voted meet next Thursday afternoon at two o'clock to give the young converts a privilege to tell their experience. And then Covenant meeting was closed and proceeded to business. Agreed with J.D. Van Patan to stay and preach to us another year for which the church has to find a house for him to live in and then closed---a special Covenant meeting appointed Thurs. next. Simon Wilcox, clerk.

Sept. 13, 1862 "Church met in Covenant meeting. Bro. Vanpatan opened by prayer then heard the brothers and sisters tell their christian experience. Then the church granted letters of dismission to Sister Betsey Wilcox, Bro. H.P. Webster and his wife. Church voted to send Bro. Simon Wilcox a letter requesting him to come and close up the charges brought against him of selling intoxicating liquors as a beverage. Church voted to withdraw hand of fellowship from Robert Clark. Closed by prayer." Wm. Gamble, clerk

October 11, 1862 "letter of confession from Simon Wilcox, voted him a letter of dismissal----voted meet each 2 months----and business meetings when necessary."

Saturday, August 14, 1864----"Opened by praise & prayer----heard the minds of the brethren, found them in union and new life and hope---- Received bro. W. Milborn and sister S. Milborn by letter---Wm. Gamble, Clerk

Saturday, October 13, 1865" Granted bro Jacob Gleason letters of dismission to unite with the Union Baptist Church, Bradford Co.-----"  
H. Milborn, clerk

January 10, 1867 "--received candidates for baptism as follows; Samuel Clark, Benjamin Lucas, Wm. Ayres, Mary Clark, Emma Runnels, Margaret Gamble, Jane Herriot----closed by prayer." H. Milborn, clerk

March 12, 1867---"Samuel Lewis, Ambrase Duffy received to be baptized at opportunity-----".

December 11, 1869 "Candidates for baptism, Oliver Clark, George Clark, Catharine Clark, Harriet Clark, Wm. Morrison, Charles Lewis, Eliz. Downing, John Lloyd, Lena Lloyd and Hannah Morrison."

Saturday, January 16, 1870 "Covenant meeting met at the church and heard the brethren and sisters tell of the goodness of God and of his love to them,----heard the experience of nine candidates for baptism--- voted to receive George Roland, I.S. Brown, George Wolf and wife, Alice Gamble, Sarah Milborn, Lucy Gamble, Francis Gamble, Els Milborn. Made arrangements to try and secure services of Elder Hart of Stony Fork for half of the time, if not the whole time. Closed by prayer by "Elder Hart"

February 12, 1870--"letter granted sister Rodman at her request to unite with another church of same faith----also same to Bro. Remington and wife----Heard the experience of male candidates for baptism as follows:

April 10, 1870---"met in regular covenant meeting----few present on account of brethren being down river and (off ?) a rafting----

July 9, 1870----"a petition from members 15 miles down the creek to be set off in a separate church on account of the distance from here---- a petition from Warner Lewis and several others for privilege of forming another church on Fabs Creek----same reason, distance so far, streams to cross and roads so bad. Letters asked for by several---- granted as soon as they have their church located and organized. Closed by singing. I.S. Brown, clerk

August 13, 1870----"Church met for Covenant meeting opened by prayer by Bro. Samuel Campbell----proceeded to hear from brethren and sisters, heard from fifty one members----all seemed to be united in the services of their Heavenly Father and all encouraged in the cause of Christ and determined to serve him while they live. Business done was 8 delegates app. to meet at coming Association. to be held 25 August:

Simon Ward received----voted to exclude George Roland and George Clark from being members for disorderly conduct.----"

September 10, 1870--"opened by prayer by Samuel Campbell--Bro. George Campbell was restored to membership---George Clark and Anna Clark received to go forward on the morrow in the Holy Ordinance of Baptism--

October 8, 1870 "George Wolf and wife granted dismissalal letter to unite with another church in Jersey Shore----"

May 13, 1871--"Lydia Hatfield received as a member on her experience-- Mrs. Jane Postreander received as candidate for baptism----"

July 8, 1871--"Bro. A.S. Clark and Bro. H. Gamble to go see I.C. Brown-- he having been absent for three or four meetings----"

September 9, 1871 "Charges made against Andy Gamble and Bro. Samuel Clark for conduct unbecoming a Christian--Bro. H. Milburn and Henry Gamble app. to go visit Andy Gamble and try persuade him to come back to the fold--- A.S. Clark and Matilda Brown chosen to go visit Bro. Samuel Clark and try and induce him to be a more faithful servant of Jesus. Closed by singing I.C. Brown, clerk

January 13, 1872 "Charges against Samuel Clark withdrawn, he having confessed his doing wrong and wished to be forgiven----Sister Margaret Gamble to visit Mrs. Andy Gamble and try to convince him of his wrong in not attending church meeting----"

March 2, 1872 "Charges made against Mrs Postreander for unchristian conduct---Committee named to visit Alice Putnam at Wellsboro and ascertain if she has forsaken the faith----"

Sat. Oct. 13, 1872 "Bro. George N. Clark restored to membership--- Resolved to meet every four weeks and not every 2nd Saturday in the month as formerly----" I.C. Brown, clerk

November 9, 1872 "Simon Ward granted dismissalal to join with church at Blossburgh"

Sat. July 5, 1872 "Church set for business, Bro. H. Gamble moderator opened----Resolved that clerk should write letters to members that are far away and to visit--- Robert Clark and wife, Maladysburgh, Robert Campbell, Lucieuffy and wife, Samuel Campbell and wife, George N. Clark and wife, Frederic Campbell, G.P. Galahan and wife, Sarah Blackwell, Jane Walters, Rachel Watson, Margaret Campbell, Sarah Jenkins, Martha Blackwell, Min. Downing, Willis Heart, Lydia Campbell, Jane Tomk, Mary A. Blackwell, Annie Hemmison.

February 14, 1874 "Jefferson Gamble chosen clerk to replace I.C. Brown"

April 25, 1874 "There was no covenant meeting on this day for the day was stormy and the most of the church off down the river----"

November 6, 1875 "Ordinance of baptism to be administered on the morrow to following candidates: Rebecca Gamble Mrs. R. Hawley  
Mrs. Nettie Milborn Betsy Heritt"

February 26, 1876 "Bro. Jesse Milborn restored he having confessed his wrong doings and his desire to be once more a member of the household of God----"

May 20, 1876 "Sisters Fanny Gamble and N.J. Brown appointed to go and see the members that do not attend and see what is in the way that they don't come----"

December 2, 1876 "Opening prayer by Bro. Hurd of Oregon Hill---not many present on account of weather and the getting over Pine Creek for it is a closing up with ice but had a very good meeting----"

December 30, 1876 "Had no meeting today for the snow was too deep for anyone to get out to the church house----"

January 27, 1877 "Sister Augusta Martin united with the church by her experience"

February 24, 1877 No meeting----Bad weather

Oct. March 19, 1881 No meeting today----it rained all day and the brethren were all away rafting.

November 24, 1883 "Met for regular Covenant meeting----opened by reading the Word of God and prayer by Bro. John Wolf----although there was a sad feeling in the hearts of the Brethren and sisters when they saw the vacant seat of Bro. John Gamble which had been so faithfully filled for years in the service of the Lord----and hoping that they might profit by the example that he had set before the world----The church was much encouraged by the presents of Bro. John Wolf and R.R. Stradley---had a good and profitable meeting for the Lord's presence was certainly in their midst"

A lengthy account of death and funeral here of which we only give pertinent excerpts:

Mrs. Sarah Mariah Wilson - died at residence of her son A. A. Emick, Oct. 7, 1895 few days after fall from a chair. She was born in Athens, Bradford Co., Pa., July 7, 1807 so was 88 years, 3 mos. at her death---eulogy follows---omitted here-----

"Mrs. Wilson was a daughter of Aaron Webster who died when she was 4 years old and she went soon to live with a family named Elliott. She remembered the first court held in Wellsboro--about 1813. After leaving Elliott's she lived a year with John Morris of Wellsboro----for next 5 years with William Becho, Sr. About 1820 her mother married (2) William Babb, Sr. then she lived with them. In 1827 she was married to William Emick and to him had nine children: William B.; Parkelia; John J.; Alfred A.; George E.; Thomas L.; Justina; Samuel; and Alexander of which these five underlined survive her. She spent a few years at Camp Corners (now Oregon Hill) three years in Manchester (now Anacua) but much of her life in Babb's Creek (now Morris) in Morris Twp., Tioga Co. Her husband, the Rev. William Emick was a Baptist preacher and he died in 1849.

"In 1854 she married (2) John Wilson with whom she lived 37 years, he died in 1891 and after his death she lived with her son Alfred Emick.

"When she began life there were only log cabins, fireplace the only stove and to crane in the corner was hung the iron pot---pine knot served as lamp at night until came the tallow dip---the ox was man's best friend--few books, papers, teachers or preachers, etc.---Funeral sermon by Rev. Bradford of Stony Fork, assisted by Rev. J.W. Leach and Rev. I. Henry Weeks. Burial Mt. Pleasant M. E. Cemetery

(Interesting Article Written by Mrs. C. E. Jennings, of Wellsboro.)

On July 14, 1806, Benjamin Wistar Morris and his wife, Mary Wells Morris, conveyed to John Fleming, William Hill Wells and William Ellis, as trustees, 190 acres of land "for the use of Tioga county forever." The selection of this site was the culmination of plans of Mr. Morris, chief of the "Tioga county land office," in honor of his wife.

Soon he caused an advertisement to be inserted in the Lyeoming Gazette offering superior inducements to purchasers of lots. A choice of the first ten lots, 60 x 270 feet would be sold for \$20 each, also the privilege of purchasing 50 acres adjoining the limits of the town at \$2.50 an acre, payable in four, five or six years. The Pine Creek Lumber Co. made a similar offer to farmers to purchase farms of from 100 to 200 acres.

At this time, Mr. Morris had set apart a half acre, on what was later known as Academy Hill, to be used as a grave yard. In time, it began to be crowded, and another burial place was secured. Many were reluctant to abandon the old graveyard and were opposed to the removal of the remains of their friends. To them, the place was a sacred spot hallowed by the tenderest memories.

However, a number were removed to the beautiful new cemetery, and the old spot was left, except in rare instances, to a state of neglect. The remains of Benj. Wistar Morris, who died in 1825, and those of his wife, who died in 1819, were removed to the northeast corner of the new cemetery.

Below is a list of those graves still marked by stones in a state of good preservation, while many are unmarked, and some have markers of plain native stone. Among them are to be found the graves of three soldiers who fought for the independence of America, and other pioneers who gave to Wellsboro the benefit of their integrity and loyalty.

Abner Jackson, a Revolutionary war soldier, had lived in a small frame house diagonally across from the Dr. Shaker house. He was greatly interested in hunting for minerals, firmly believing that wonderful resources were hidden in the Hills of Tioga county and claimed to be the first suggester of the presence of coal in the county.

He was the grandfather of Mary Emily Jackson, who was a pupil at the Wellsboro Academy in 1828, and who developed a good deal of literary ability. Her poems were published, and were pronounced equal to any written by Mrs. Hemans, the poetess of that day. Miss Mary Miller, of Wellsboro, is a descendant of Ebenezer Jackson. The stone which marked his grave has been destroyed.

Israel Greenleaf, another soldier of the Revolutionary War, was a well known early citizen, and lived in a frame house near the present home of Hon. David Cameron, and made wagons in a large building located on the present site of the Hon. A. E. Dunsmore residence. He died June 1, 1847, aged 82 years. Sarah, his wife, died in 1840. It is said that one of his descendants, J. Emory Bryant, of Crookedcreek, has in his possession a coat worn by the soldier while serving with Washington.

Joseph Thompson, a Revolutionary patriot, died Nov. 23, 1842, aged 85 years. He came to Wellsboro from Osteo county, N.Y., in 1820. A daughter, Lucretia, married James Kimball, an early hotel keeper here. Another daughter became the wife of Col. Hiram Freeborn, for many years a prominent business man of Knoxville.

Johnathan Webster, botanic physician, who it has been learned was a descendant of Noah Webster, died Aug. 15, 1843, aged 43 years, and Milly, his wife, died April 8, 1848, aged 48 years.

Amos Coolidge (grandparents of Owen B. Coolidge of Jersey Shore, Pa.) died May 16, 1851, and Pamela, his wife, died in 1843. A daughter, Mary, died in 1845. Amos Coolidge first built and lived some years in a house that stood on the site of the Bennett house, now called "Beuna Vista." He was the father of a large family, and has many descendants living in and near Wellsboro at the present time. He was an active and enterprising man, and did much to advance the material interests of the time.

Daniel Ritter died June 15, 1843, aged 43 years.

David Henry, Jr., died July 6, 1850, aged 67 years.

James Henry died Sept. 30, 1849, aged 60 years.

Rufus Butler died Dec. 6, 1847, aged 74 years.

Isabel Butler, his wife, died March 5, 1842, aged 64 years.

The Spanish American War Veterans, Father Reap and members of his congregation, members of the G.A.R., the P.O.S. of A. and several individuals have already generously shown their interest to be patriotic. But to carry on this work should appeal to every loyal son and daughter of Wellsboro.

## Historic "Hill Burying Ground"

Lycoming County, Pa.

(Lies less than a mile east of Muncy on left of public highway. Many graves unmarked - many markers no longer legible. Covers less than an acre - uncared for.) "Now & Then", Vol. 4, pg. 187, also Vol. 9, pg. 270-3. Published by Muncy Historical Society.

Jacob Hill, pioneer to Muncy Valley came from Windsor, Berks Co., Pa. One of the earliest settlers. His deed of 5-18-1778 for 42 1/2 acres. Jacob Hill and wife Magdalena had 14 children, seven boys and seven girls. Tradition says four of the boys were killed by Indians and were buried where they fell, near present Hill graveyard. David Hill, of Muncy Creek and Mary Ann, his wife procured for burying plot in 5- 6-1876.

In 1818 an Act requiring 9 months continuous service in the "Continental Line" had been passed.

In 1832 it was modified to 6 months service, not necessarily continuous, and included the militia of the various states. This Act, pensioning all Revolutionary soldiers who had served 6 months or more was passed June 7, 1832, their pensions to begin March 1, 1831.

The claimants made their declaration in open court in the county in which they were then living. By this time many of them ranged in age from 68 to 88 years. Not all could prove the necessary length of service, for various reasons. Others being in fortunate circumstances, never applied. So the list herein given does not by any means include all those who served.

The following declarations have many bracketed notes signed "W F W", who is identified as W. F. Wagner, M.D., of Washington, D.C., and Hartleton, Union Co., Pa. He was the copyist, editor and compiler of these 500 Declarations. He shows himself to be a most painstaking and careful historian. Copies of this collection are on file at the Muncy Historical Society, at the Northumberland County Historical Society, and at Harrisburg State Library.

Another Good Woman Goes the way of all the World after a brief illness.

A Member of the old Pioneer Family of Goodwin that Settled on Lillibridge Creek Many Years Ago. A long time Member of the Baptist Church. Funeral Yesterday.

Mrs. Samuel S. Steele, died quite suddenly at her home on East Mill Street, Monday evening at eleven o'clock. She had been complaining from a pain in her lungs just below the shoulder blades for several days, but as she had frequently suffered from these congestions for ten years, she wasn't considered in immediate danger. A physician was called and he treated her as he had on several previous occasions, always successfully. She fell into a deep sleep Monday evening and a few hours later was discovered in a coma state, from which she couldn't be aroused, ceasing to breathe at eleven o'clock. The news of the demise of Mrs. Steel came as a great shock to her neighbors here. She was a daughter of the Goodwin Family, that started a home in the woods on Lillibridge Creek almost seventy years ago, and is the writer is not mistaken, clearing the farm on which the daughter died Monday. The Goodwin family, enroute to Pittsburg from Massachusetts, via the Allegheny river, stopped here on account of the illness of the mother, and when she had recovered the means of the family had exhausted, necessitating its continuance here. Samuel Steel married Mary Goodwin when she was eighteen years of age, on November 12, 1839, Justice W. J. Davis officiating. She resided here while her husband was at the front, fighting his country's battles, and on his return they commenced housekeeping here. To them were born four children, one dying in infancy. The three, besides the mourning old veteran survive her. They are Samuel, who lives in the West, Mrs. Clara Hardee of Annin Creek and Samet who lives at the home. She was sixty eight years of age. She was the first member baptized in the newly organized Baptist church at Port Allegheny, more than twenty years ago and retained her membership until her demise. The funeral was held yesterday the Baptist Church, Rev. Mentzer himself a veteran, speaking a sympathetic discourse and eulogy. The remains were interred in the family lot in the Port Allegheny Cemetery. The aged husband has the sympathy of all in the loss of a helpmate and companion, the children in the loss of a good mother.

No family in Lyscoming Co, Pa has a more honorable record than the Cranes. The earliest mention of the family appears in 1637, the name being variously spelled, Crane, Cran, Crain, Craine & Crayne. JASPER CRANE, came from England 1637 with wife Alice & was the emigrant ancestor. Alice's family name is unknown. Their son JASPER CRANE, 2nd, was born 1651 & was a prominent man in New Haven Colony, & one of the original settlers of Newark, N.J. His numerous descendants are scattered throughout the middle, western & southern states. He was one of Committee of Safety to protect the New Haven colony against De Ruyter, the Dutch admiral who cruised in the Long Island Sound & threatened the settlements.

During the Revolutionary War the Connecticut Colony, to increase facilities for Coast defense, put into service 3 boats, or galleys. One was called "The Crane", named in honor of the family who stood so loyally by the Colony. It was sent to N.Y. to assist in the defense under General Washington. The exact cost of "The Crane" was recorded 1,013lbs 6s 10d

Another who gave service to the country was EBENEZER CRANE, a private of the militia designated as "Lexington Alarm". Others of the family served as privates, corporals & captain, & in all colonial wars, War of 1812 & the Mexican War. Love of country has been a distinguishing trait of the family, as well as upright business principles. . .

When Edmund Andros demanded the surrender of the charter of Connecticut, Benjamin Crane was among his opposers. Benj. Crane was a person of independence. . & deferred his marriage . . . until 30yrs of age. . under penalty of 20sh per wk. .

The Cranes are descended from Lord Arundell's family & inherit the blood of Charlemagne & HUGH CAPEL, both of whom claimed to spring from Antenor, King of Cimiriens, B.C. 1143.

Of Dame Anne Arundell it is recorded that she left by will, which was proved in 1521, money for wax tapers for the day of her burial & afterwards for use at mass, also money for bells to ring dirges at her obsequies. She willed "her best velvet gown to Chilton Church to make a vestment for the deacon". Her "best black gown furred with white, & her best black gown furred with martin & lined with velvet" fell to the lot of relatives.

Chilton, near Sudbury, in Suffolk, is the home of the Cranes. They lived at Chilton Hall, a moated manor of some distinction, & were Lords of the manor. In Chilton Church is an elaborate marble monument to the memory of Sir Robert Crane, who was knighted by James I. He is in armor kneeling with clasped hands, Dorothy, first wife lived in amity for 17 yrs. . . d 4.11.1624. Susan was 2nd wife. . .

JOHN CRANE, was clerk of the kitchen of James I, a position of much honor, & a ROBERT CRANE, of Suffolk, was one of the gentlemen chosen by Charles II, in 1666 to be made knight of the Royal Oak. He had an estate of \$75,000 a year.

The Cranes in England have borne 5 coats of arms, not certain whether all of one family. . . altho there is reason for believing there were special grants for special services. The several armorials are lacking in mottoes, with the exception of one, . . . "Deus pascit Grus" (God feeds the Cranes). They are described in the heraldry as argent; a fesse or bar between 3 crosses, crosslet, gules, crest, a crane.

Family records of the historic Crane family of Lycoming County, Pa, which were inherited by Mrs Catharine Crane Merrick, of Watertown, N.Y., formerly of Jersey Shore, Pa. These are copied in longhand, in an old ledger, which Mrs Merrick still owns.

Leonard Pfouts lived 5 mis above Northumberland on the W Branch of Susquehanna R. He m. Nancy Covenhoven, dau of Robert Covenhoven & Horey Kelsey Cutter. Their daughter, Mary Ann Pfouts m. Joseph Bailey, of Bailey's Island, opposite Jersey Shore, who went adrift in a flat boat during ice flood in February 1832.

WALTER CLARK FAMILY

So many Clarks in Lycoming Co, Pa, the letters of Harry F Bressler, of 611 Seabury Ave., Milford, Del., are of great importance in proving this line. Letters were written to Mrs P & Russell, 1315 Allegheny St, Jersey Shore, Pa.

Mrs Russell:

April 11, 1960

On Sunday I talked to Mrs Paul Bailey (\*) in Williamsport about Clark ancestors. Unfortunately hers are not mine, & my Clarks pre-date hers at Pine Creek by at least 50 yrs. . . . .

My Clarks came out of old Lancaster Co, now Dauphin Co - in 1750 were at Clark's Ferry located in Paxtang Twp. . . .

By 1775 ROBERT CLARK was at Lewisburg (1715-1798). . . . He and only son Colonel JOHN CLARK (1736-1809) are both buried at Lewisburg.

His brothers were WALTER, and WILLIAM. He had 2 sisters, one of whom married (Robert) Fruit. \*\* (Seed of 1771 Fruit to Walter Clark. Robert's will names Walter, his bro., as executor.

William & Walter Clark came to White Deer (Twp\*\*) Many Seeds. William died 1813. . he was an original settler of (now \*\*) Union Co, next to the Lycoming Co line. His children were: William; James; Walter; Flavel; and 5 daughters. Mary married James Forrester, who died before 1791.

Walter, Sr sold. . lands 1802 & went to Mercer Co, Pa. Two sons, William & James, had Rev. War patents 1813. Walter, Sr., was representative of old Northumberland Co to Provincial Assembly at Phila in 1775.

1778 Memorial at Pine Creek (? \*\*) signed by Walter Clark, James Clark, James Forrester, William Clark & Robert Fruit. These were either William Clark's sons & son-in-law James Forrester, the Fruit being a cousin, or Walter Clark's sons, & cousin.

Coming the other way my grandmother, Sarah Rebecca Clark, born 1754, oldest dau. of Joseph Clark at Beech Creek, - - Joseph born at Beech Creek 1824 & died at Flemington 1890) - he was youngest son - older brothers James, bn 1822, & William, bn 1820 - of William Clark & Sarah Love. This WILLIAM was oldest settler at Beech Creek. Both WILLIAM, & SARAH LOVE were born near Pine Creek, in Wayne or Nippenose Twp, in latter part of 1786 or 1787. William died 1851 (his will recorded at Lock Haven) and Sarah in 1853.

(\*) Mrs Paul Bailey was then regent of Lycoming Chapter DAR at Williamsport, Pa.

\*\* Additions by Mrs Russell.

\*Sarah Love is the daughter of either John or Robert Love, the two older sons of Robert Love, Sr, so of course grand-daughter of Robert Love, Sr., of Wayne Twp. (then Lycoming, now Clinton Co., Pa --) I believe her mother was Alice Love who married William Hensley, and George Love of Waterville, her brother. . .

\*Grandma died 1937, but while she was living. . . of course she knew her great grandparents. . . & there was a CLARK FAMILY MILIA which, alas, was in oldest son William's hands & went to Louisiana about 50 yrs ago with a William Clark from Peach Creek.

\*In 1925 my father & I (we then lived at Williamsport) went to Grandma's great-grandparents graves. Dad said then that long ago Walter Clark had come from White Bear & settled there. I believe this Walter of course, is either a son of Walter Clark, Sr., or of William Clark, Sr. (2 bro's with sons of same name). . .

\*Buffalo Cross Roads Presbyterian Church records of 1741 shows 2 pews held by Walter Clark, Sr. (he had m. a sonice -) and by William Clark (he had m. and Elizabeth --) & the widow, Mary Clark Forrester.

\*I recently went to the location but didn't have time to find the graves, but my William Clark 1786-1851 's father is buried along Antas Creek, just towards Jersey Shore. At that time (1925) we crossed Antas Creek over a wood bridge & then about 500 ft along a curve. . . Dad got out of car & walked toward the creek & found the graves. . . Today the bridge is at new location & grade of road changed. . . so far as I know Walter Clark & his wife unknown are buried there. . .

\*So, summing up, Walter Clark was there in 1778. It is barely possible that Dad may have known about Walter Clark, Sr, & was referring to him, & thus the Clark buried here is another son of Walter Clark & not Walter, the son of either Walter, Sr or William, Sr., the two brothers.

\*Mercer County records show William & James Clark, two sons of Walter Clark, Sr., & BOTH Revolutionary War veterans, there by 1813. Campbell Co records show Walter, Sr., going there 1802.

\*. . . here I am stuck. . . (not knowing which Clark is buried there). . . could be Walter, the son of either Walter or William. . . could even be William, son of the William who went to Mercer Co. . .

\*While I don't know exactly how, Grandma could have told me, we are related to a Barclay family around Waspert- could be through a Clark girl - a dau of Walter buried here & a sister of William (1786-1851).

\*. . . my Clark's are not Mrs Bailey's Clarks (of the Pine Creek Valley) nor are they the Clarks of Orinda who came Thomas Clark, born 1756, whose descendants are still in Hippenose Valley. . . This Thomas is a son of JOHN CLARK at Ft Loudon. . . I doubt if related to my Clarks. . .



Letter No 2 of May 7, 1960: (Excerpts)

"I am not confused at all. I have a complete list of all Clark records of Chester Co from 1700 to 1790. I also have every deed, will, etc. . of old Northumberland Co, Lycoming & Clinton Cos, plus (historians J B Linn & J F Meginness, plus, more important. . I was born at my grandmother's and lived there every summer till I was 18.

"My grandmother Sarah Rebecca Clark was born 9.4.1854 near Beech Creek. She told me long ago all her ancestors. . . . her great grandfather THOMAS MANN was a Rev War soldier & this is confirmed by Massachusetts records. Born 1750 & died 4.12.1820 at Wales, NY. His children came to Center Co, all the Manns, including Robert Thomas Mann (1794-1863) her grandfather.

"Her grandmother was Eva Weber (1794-1881) a dau. of DAVID WEBBER, Jr., son of David, Sr, a Rev War soldier, this confirmed by J B Linn & Pa Archives.

"My grandfather, as oldest son, born 1849, had the old Fahringer ? Bible - his great grandfather was Lt John Decker? (or Decker?) & greatgreatgrandfather was John Peter Decker? of Reading.

"So - my grandma knew all her ancestors. She said the first Clark of our line in Old Lycoming County was Walter Clark, & I believe her. It is also confirmed by other records. . . The one thing I don't know is the name of the Clark buried near Lochabar Farm (on Antes Creek\*\*). I was to the grave in 1924 with my Dad but didn't get out of the car. Dad did, & he went to the graves, but didn't take any notes, or leave the record.

"My Clarks are not the Tom Clarks of Oriole. . .but they may be back in Chester Co. Tom Clarke died 1764 in Chester Co - his oldest son was a John, & mentions his grandson Thomas in will. . . I have (Tom Clarke of Oriole) has complete record. He was born 1756 at Ft. Loudon, the son of JOHN CLARK. His oldest son was born 1786, the same year as my Clark buried at Beech Creek. Tom's third son was William, bn 1790, he is buried at Collomsville. I have the complete data on them from John's family Bible at Oriole. .

"Sarah Rebecca Clark was 3rd child of Joseph Clark & NAOMI ELIZ. MANN, bn Beech Creek 9.4.1854 & died 1937. Her older bros. were Joseph & Nathaniel, 1850 & 1852 respectively. Joe died in Wmsport & not in Flemington.

"Joseph Clark (1824-1890?) was youngest son of William Clark. . Died at Flemington. .? His older bros. were James, bn 1822 & William, bn 1821.

"WILLIAM CLARK (1786-1851) married Sarah Love (1787-1853) for whom Grandma was named. They are buried Pres. Cem. at Beech Creek. William was born around Pine Creek somewhere. Tombstone gives date of death & age. . . HIS FATHER is buried near Lochabar (on Antes Creek). . .

This letter con'd next page. . . .

" WALTER CLARK, Sr, WILLIAM CLARK, Sr, & Robert CLARK were brothers in Upper Paxton Twp, now Dauphin Co, (then Lancaster Co). . . Robert bn 1715, d. 1798. His will is on record, . names bro. Walter as executor, with his only son Col. John Clark (1736-1809). Col. John's only son was Joseph, I have further data here.

"WILLIAM CLARK, SR, died 1813, had 9 children, married an Elizabeth - -. Mary, & four sisters, sons Walter, James, Flavel, William.

"Walter Clark, Sr, left no will, I believe died in Mercer Co, Pa. . . George, Robert & Walter Clark settled Paxton Twp in 1750. . . ) gives some scattered references here. . says were many deeds. . . . repeats some of the former letter. . . .)

"Going back to Chester Co records, I also have Cope's "Genealogy of Clarks".

"A Walter Clark, grandson of Gabriel Clark, came into Chester Co out of Maryland 1718 & first son was John bn 1719. A bro. Nathaniel also came thru Chester Co to Lancaster Co with 7 sons. Unfortunately, 3 Clarks died between 1720 & 1730 without records (Many? or naming ?) children - a John, a William, & a Henry.

"Tax records show a Walter Clark, single, in 1742, & in 1764 a tax record shows him with 5 sons - John, James, Francis another, & a young man named William.

"Again, in Northumberland records about 1770 three Clarks show up. (North'd Co formed 1772 \*\*), . & you can find five names in records of thosetimes. . . . In 1775 WALTER CLARK came to White Deer, also his bro. William. Robert stayed at Lewisburg (then North'd now Union Co -) Antes Crk & Pine Crk about 25 m. up White Deer Valley. . . Robert 1715-1798; William ca 1725; Walter ca 1718-1720. . . .

"Neither are my clarks the Chillisquaque Clarks & since I know from records that Walter Clark's children were there in 1770, at least by 1775. . . .

"As to Sarah Love. . we are related to the Love's at Waterville. . & to the Ramseys there, thru probably Alice Love who m. William Ramsey about 1820 at Ramsey. . . . (also). . a bro-in-law's grandmother was an Alice Ramsey, bn at Ramsey about 1880 ? . . He also says it is a possibility that the grave at Antes Creek is named Francis. . ?

"I remember Lyc. Co records show a James Clark in the Chillisquaque area. . in the will of William Clark who died about 1820 at Chillisquaque. . . ."

(5) Walter Clark's family - the "Weber" line:

"letter of Mr Dressler of 9.13.1761 to Mrs Russell:

"I can tell you there were 2 Weber's (or Weavers ?) as an angelized spelling, in Center County . one was a weaver, around Bellefonte about 1800. . . of him I know little & he could have been a bro of my David. . . I will give you what I know of my own line of Webers, or Weavers:

"John David Weber, a veteran of the Rev. War, (see Linn, also Van Archives at Bethlehem ) was bn at Bethlehem 1753 & died Center Co, Pa 1827, buried at Aaronsburg. . . he was probably son of George Weber who m. Catherine Barbara Keller at Bethlehem in 1748.

"He also m. Eva Margaret Musser (1759-1804) at Bethlehem & came to Aaronsburg in 1783 - buried there.

"David Weber, Jr, born about 1773 and m. Eva Stever, a dau. of Jacob Stever - the son of Valentine Stever, a soldier of the Revolution, according to Historian Linn. (He was at a place called Stever's Gap & this is near Becker's Valley - also my ancestors)

"Their children were:

George Michael Weber, born 1794  
 Catherine Weber born 1796, my ancestress  
 Philip Weber  
 Elizabeth Weber  
 Sarah Weber  
 Christina Weber, Wehler, or Weaver.

\* Catherine, bn 1796, m. Robert Thomas Mann & are buried at top a little hill at Conola (Center Co). Also buried with the Webers is Elizabeth Mann who never married, (1801 - 1880). She was sister of my Robert Thomas Mann, at Aaronsburg."

See also Milton Pusey's "Historical & Biographical" Clinton County, 1892. He says on page 307:

"JAMES CLARK, Esq (son of William) was born at Beech Creek July 26, 1821. In 1850 he married Rebecca Ann Quiggle, a daughter of Nicholas Quiggle of Beech Creek Township. They had 4 sons and 3 daus:

Egle's Notes & Queries, III Ser., Vol 3, pp 262-4 gives the father of first named William above & story of their family. He names Sarah Patterson as the wife but also names 11 children, adding Patalina & Jane as daughters.

In "TOWNSTONE inscriptions of Revolutionary Soldiers & their wife in Warren Co, Pa., we note the following:

"SAMUEL CLARK 1754 - 1833. He was born 1754 & notice of his death in "Voice of the People" Dec 25, 1832 reads: "Died. In Conowango Twp on Sunday the 15th, Mr Samuel Clark. He was married April 10, 1797 to Catherine Reese, who received a pension after his death. Wid. file 2530.

"On Sept 6, 1849 James Morrison made affidavit "that he knew Samuel & Catherine Clark before their marriage when they lived in Lycoming Co, Pa, in eastern part of state. Morrison came to Warren Co in 1799 to find a place to settle & on his return home learned of the marriage, & he has known them ever since. . . ."

(Note: Catherine Reese was dau of Martin Reese (1745-1832) who lived first on Pine Creek, then to Warren Co. He left a will, naming all his children.

In the name of God, Amen, the fourth day of April, 1711, I, senior of the town of New London, in the county of New London, in the Colony of Conecticut in New England, Saylor (?), Being well and stricken in years, But of perfect mind and Memory Thanks be given unto God Therefore callin into mind the Mortality of my Body and Knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Dye, Do Make and ordaine this my last Will and Testament, That is to say Principally And first of all, I, Give and bequeathe my soul into the hands of God that gave it, And my body I recommend to the earth to be Buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my executor, Nothing Doubting but at the Generall Resurrection, I shall receive the same againe by the Mighty Power of God, and as touching such earthly estate as it has pleased God to Bless me with in this Life, I Give, Demise and dispose of the same in the Following Manner And form - As for my eldest son Daniel Dart, he having ben ungrateful and treacherous to me And I having already given to him my s'd son Daniel between ninety and one hundred pounds - And my Daughter Dina Hatch, hath already received her portion of my estate - in primis, I give & bequeath to my eldest Son Daniel Dart, five shillings of Money to be levied out of my estate, and paid by my executor, hereafter named, jtem I give to my beloved Daughter Dina Hatch, five shillings of Money to be raised and levied out of my estate, and paid by my executor - jtem, I Give to my beloved Sonns, Richard Dart, Rogger Dart and Ebenezer Dart all my stock of Cattell, to say, all my nete cattell, sheep, and swine, hogs and kind, or any other Creatures of mine, With all my husbandrie utencels, to be equally Divided between them the s'd Richard Dart - Rogger and Ebenezer - jtem I Give to my well beloved son, Richard Dart five pounds, which his brother Roger is to pay him and of the twenty pounds Rogger is obliged to pay me - jtem I give to my well beloved Daughter Bethiah Chappel,

the fether bed which I use to lye on with one paire of sheets and one Blankitt and one coverlid - Jtem I give all the remainder of my in-doors household stuff to my three well beloved Daughters Ann Morgan, Bethiah Chapell and Sarah Bishop // to be equally Divided between them Jtem I Do Constitute, make and ordaine my well beloved Son Rogger Dart my sole executor, of this my last will and Testament Ratifying & Confirming this and no other to be my Will and Testament, In Witness whereof, I have hereunto sett my hand and seale the Day and yeare and written.

## A LITTLE HISTORY OF WELSHANS CLAN

August 10, 1934

CONRAD WELSHANS, born March 31, 1761 in Germany, settled at York, Pa.,  
died May 18, 1827 at Milton, Pa., buried in Milton Cemetery where machine  
shops are now located, adjoining cemetery, aged 66 years. His wife, EVA,  
born in 1757 moved with son, WILLIAM WELSHANS, to Halls, Lycoming Co.,  
and later to Nippenose Valley where she died in 1842, aged 85 years,  
buried in Limestone Cemetery.

CONRAD WELSHANS belonged to the York Co. Militia during Revolution War.  
He was also a gunsmith and helped to make guns to lick the Red Coats. The  
above CONRAD WELSHANS if the forefather of all the Welshans who have set-  
tled in Nippenose Valley and surrounding communities.

THE WELSHANS CLAN have played an important part in securing the freedom  
of our country and in helping to establish our government. They have taken  
part in all the wars of importance that our country has waged. These  
records taken from the Penna. Archives, Harrisburg, show the following

WILLIAM WELSHANS, grandfather of Okie (Oakland) Welshans and that generation lived at Halls Station, Lycoming Co., Pa. He was overseer of farm and also canal contractor. He moved on and bought what is known as Okie Welshans farm in 1837. He erected the house now standing. The farm contained 460 acres including Shadle and Welshans property. William Welshans lived and reared his family and died on this farm. He was born 1792 at Harrisburg, Pa., died Jan. 14, 1871, aged 79. He was buried in Limestone Cemetery. He was married twice. First wife, Elizabeth Griffin he married October 4, 1814. Second wife was Margaret Jodun. 19 Children were born to these unions, six to first wife and 13 to second wife. Twins died young, others grew to manhood and womanhood. Abram Welshans, a brother to William owned what is now the Grant Welshans and Grant Showers farm. Rebecca Welshans Sallada owned Stewart Groupe farm. William Welshans, Jr. built the house and owned the property or farm next to his father William Welshans, Sr. This farm has continued on by his son Nelson Welshans and his son Sees (Jacob Sees) Welshans.

At one time the greater part of upper end of Nippenose Valley was owned by the Welshans families. This indicates that they are a thrifty, industrious people. Nearly all the earlier Welshans were farmers and many are still following that occupation at present. A number of them are fond of hunting and fishing. They are a hearty people and live to be three score and ten years.

(The Welshans family had annual reunions but have no long. This writeup was made when they met in 1934, unsigned, but of interest) Copy now owned by Evelyn Welshans Jenkins of R. D. #2, Jersey Shore, Lycoming Co., Pa.

HON. SAMUEL BAKER Continued

After Burgoyne's surrender he was found by an American officer who gave him \$2 and sent him home. This was in 1781. He was then age 18 and enlisted in Col. Marius Willett's regiment and took part in the skirmish of Canada Creek, in which the noted Tory leader, Capt. Walter Butler was killed.

In 1786 he married ELIZABETH DANIELS, daughter of Richard Daniels ... built a cabin at junction of Tioga & Cowanesque Rivers.. was first settler in the Tioga Valley in Penna.....

SAMUEL HARRIS, son of JOHN HARRIS, founder of city of Harrisburg, Pa., who located at Painted Post was his nearest neighbor... and next to him was COLONEL NEMONY, below Big Flats... He was soon joined by Capt. Amos Stone....

In 1788 he (i.e. Baker) brought in his wife and infant dau. accompanied by his wife's parents. Baker died Dec. 2, 1842 and left his wife, 3 daughters, and one son WILLIAM BAKER.

Pg. 526: RICHARD DANIELS, FATHER-IN-LAW OF SAMUEL BAKER, was born Albany, N.Y.... served in French and Indian War in 1754... soon afterward he married CORNELIA HOS, relative of Martin Van Buren... Daniels was a Loyalist During the Rev... but his wife was a true & spirited American & in every respect was his superior. Besides the daughter ELIZABETH who was m. to SAMUEL BAKER, there was another daughter MARY, unmarried and who likely died young.

JOHN NEWELL, received a pension for his service in the American Revolution. (Claim No. 14013) He was born at Dudley, Mass. 5-7-1743, resided at Brimfield, Mass. during the Rev. & enlisted at Brimfield 8-1-1775. He came to Tioga Co. early in 1800s & died there 1824. He is buried in Nutty Cemetery on the Tri-County line (Tioga, Bradford & Lycoming Cos.) He was twice married, (1) to MARY WILLIARD in 1767 and (2) to HANNAH WILCOX in 1773. He raised a large family. NEWELLTOWN was named for him.

Pg. 207 & 526: Within a few months after his coming Mr. Baker was joined by AMOS STONE, who was a captain in the Connecticut Line during the Revolutionary War, but who afterwards became an active participant in Shay's Rebellion. Shay was defeated January 25, 1787, and his adherents were forced to seek refuge from the Federal authorities wherever they could. He m. ELIZABETH IVES in winter of 1789 and raised a family, one son named GEORGE HARVEY (The Ives were from Bristol, Conn.)

Pg. 207 & 530: ADAM and GEORGE HART, natives of Germany, and pioneer settlers in Lawrence township, served seven years each in the Revolutionary army. Adam removed to Mansfield in 1823 and George became an early settler in Liberty Township, where his descendants still reside. George Hart m. Magdalena Schappert at Reading & raised a family.

Fig. 207 & 794: ANDREW HOLIDAY, a native of Ireland, came to America before the Revolution, and finally settled at Stroudsburg, Monroe County, Penna. He served in the Continental army and was a good soldier. A few years later he removed to Troupsburg, New York, but soon afterward returned to Tioga County, and settled near Elkland, where he died early in the present century. Twice m., two children to first wife & 7 to the 2nd. wife.

Fig. 405: REUBEN COOK, SR., the pioneer settler of the Cowanesque, west of Lawrenceville, was a Revolutionary soldier. He settled in what afterward became Nelson township in 1792 and 1793. It is not known in what command he served, but he was granted a pension of \$40 a year during life by the legislature of Pennsylvania in 1823. For a fuller account of him the reader is referred to the chapter devoted to Nelson Borough. Was b. 1747, d. at Osceola, Pa. 6-23-1829. W. SARAH COLE (1757-1833) buried at Osceola Cemetery.

Fig. 860 HEBENEZER SEELYE, a native of Connecticut, settled immediately east of Academy Corners in 1798, and resided there until his death, June 23, 1837, in the eighty-second year of his age. He served throughout the Revolutionary War in Sheldon's Light Horse, a Connecticut company, and a portion of the time under Washington. Before coming to Tioga County he became a Quaker, and was a consistent adherent of that faith during the remainder of his life. He lies buried in the old Quaker burying ground at Knoxville. He m. in Conn. to Rehetabel Toad who died 5-27-1837 in 83rd yr. Chn: Rehetabel, Anna, Lucina, Laura, Julius, Masson, Harvey, Eleazer, & Sally, who was b. 5-4-1800.

Fig. 208: SIMON RIXFORD or RIXFORD, the first settler on the site of Knoxville, where he located in 1799, was a native of Massachusetts. At the age of fifteen years he enlisted in the Revolutionary army and served seven years. He was afflicted with deafness caused by Proximity to artillery during battle. In 1820 he removed to Mixtown, Clymer, Twp., where he passed the remainder of his life and where he lies buried.

Fig. 852 & 208: ISRAEL BULKLEY, who came from Connecticut in 1800 and settled upon the farm in Osceola now occupied by his grandson, CHARLES BULKLEY, served a brief time in CAPT. E. WATERMAN'S company, Twentieth Regiment, Connecticut militia, when the British burned New London, Conn., in September, 1781. He m. LUCY CHAPIN (b. 11-22-1767) Chn: Ralph, George; Lucy; Ira; Hiram; Newton; & Charles.

Fig. 1071: NATHANIEL BRASLY HOODY, a native of Haverhill, Mass., where he was born in 1760, entered the Continental army at the age of sixteen years and served through the Revolution. In 1795 he settled at Wyzox, Bradford County, Pennsylvania, lived there a number of years, and then removed to Osceola, where he died in 1840, and where he lies buried. His gt-gd-father, WM. HOODY, came from Scotland in 1632.

Fig. 208: DAVID JAY, an early settler of Osceola, was a Revolutionary Soldier. But little is known concerning him. His remains lies buried in the Osceola Cemetery.

Pg. 208: AYRES TUTTLE, a pioneer settler at Westfield, fought at Bunker Hill, as a member of the patriot band who so stoutly resisted the British on that occasion.

Pg. 208: DANIEL LEE, who came to Tioga County from Otsego County, New York, and was an early settler in Chatham Township, was a soldier of the Revolutionary army. Many of his descendants still reside in Chatham township.

Pg. 855 & 208: SAMUEL TUBBS, SR., a native of Lyme, Connecticut, settled at Elkland in 1811. He came to Pennsylvania in 1773, with his parents, and settled in Wyoming. August 26, 1776, he enlisted in Capt. Robert Durkee's Independent company, which was attached to Col. John Durkee's regiment of the Connecticut line. He participated in the battle of Bound Brook, Mill Stone River, Mud Creek, Brandywine and Germantown; wintered with the army at Valley Forge, and served in Sullivan's Expedition against the Indians in 1779. His command was on its way to Wyoming the night of the massacre, and stopped at Shoup's Tavern, Northumberland county, Pennsylvania. He died at his home near Elkland, Sept. 7, 1841, and his remains rest in the cemetery at Osceola. A son of Lebbeus & Bathsheba Hamilton Tubbs. Wife was SARAH S. DORRANCE - eleven children.

Pg. 208 & 1021: JOHN RYAN, SR., a pioneer settler at Elkland, whose parents were natives of Ireland, was born on the Atlantic Ocean, March 10, 1748, while they were enroute for New York. He removed to the Wyoming Valley, Pennsylvania, before the Revolution. The records in the War Department at Washington show that he served during the Revolutionary War as a private in Capt. Thaddeus Weed's, formerly, Capt. Solomon Strong's Company, Fifth Connecticut Regiment, commanded by Col. Philip B. Bradley, from July 1777 to December 1780, and that he re-enlisted October 20, 1780, "for during the war." The records also show that he served as a sergeant in the Fifth Company, formerly Capt. Thaddeus Weed's Company, Second Connecticut Regiment, commanded by Col. Heman Swift, from March, 1781 to April, 1783. A portion of t his time he was on duty in the commissary department in New York. He was afterward pensioned, as a Revolutionary Soldier, by the State of Connecticut. m. SARAH GOODALE & settled near Wilkes-Barre.

Pg. 209: JOHN E. BROWN, one of the pioneer settlers of Brookfield Twp., was a Revolutionary Soldier, though it is not known in what command he served. He settled in Brookfield township in 1812.

Pg. 209: AZEL NOBLES, one of the pioneers of Brookfield Twp., served in the Revolutionary War, for which service he received a pension until the time of his death. His son, ASAH EL NOBLES, was a soldier in the War of 1812.

Pg. 209 & 505: JESSE LOEHY, the first settler on the site of Tioga Boro. was another Revolutionary soldier. He claimed to have participated in the Battle of Bunker Hill, being sixteen years old at the time, and to also have witnessed the execution of Maj. John Andre, at Tappan, New Jersey, October 2, 1780. He died March 12, 1844, aged eighty-five, and lies buried in the cemetery at Holidaytown.

Pg. 86 & 209: HARRIS HUTCHKISS, who settled at Tioga in 1804, was a native of Conn., and a Revolutionary sailor and soldier. While in the marine service he was captured by the British and confined for some time in chains on board the notorious prison ship "Jersey". He suffered much by exposure to cold and from want of proper food. He died Nov. 21, 1854, aged ninety-six years, and lies buried in the old cemetery at Tioga.

Pg. 121 & 209: ROBERT and BENJAMIN PATTERSON, who acted as guides for the party who constructed the Williamson road in 1792-93, were noted Indian scouts during the Revolution, rendering valuable service to the cause of liberty. After the opening of the William road they settled at Painted Post, New York.

Page 209 & 555: In what is known as the Bentley burying ground in Rutland Township, west of Roseville, is a tombstone bearing the following inscription:

DANIEL WATTLEES,

A Soldier of the Revolution.

Born in Connecticut in 1761; died in Tioga County, Pennsylvania, May 19, 1839.

This stone was erected in his memory by J.W. Wattlees, of Bradford County as a mark of filial affection and gratitude.

DANIEL WATTLEES was one of the early settlers in Rutland Township, but the year of his coming could not be ascertained. He served during the Revolutionary War in Capt. William Moulton's company of the Second Battalion, raised for the defense of the Connecticut coast, from Horse-neck to New Haven. He was hired by the town of Lebanon, Connecticut, and joined the Company July 25, 1781.

Pg. 209: STEPHEN MORRILL, SR., A native of Maine, and an early settler of Jackson Township, was a veteran of the Revolution. His son, Stephen, served in the War of 1812, in a marine regiment. Had 8 chn: Stephen; Asa; Jane; Mary; Bertha; Hiram; Jefferson; & William.

Pg. 209: JAMES GRAY, SR., came from Otsego county, New York, and settled at Gray's Valley, in Sullivan Township, in 1805, and was one of the pioneers of the township. He was born in Sharon, Conn., in 1760, served seven years in the Continental army and was discharged with the rank of captain. He died in Sullivan Township in March, 1846.

Pg. 210 & 1087: RUSSELL NOSH, settled in what is now Ward Township in 1807, but soon afterward removed to and located near the State Road in Sullivan Township. He was born in Connecticut, June 11, 1753, and when twenty-three years of age enlisted in the Continental army and remained until the war ended, rendering good and efficient service. While in camp at Valley Forge he was promoted to serve as an aide on Washington's staff. He died in Sullivan township June 1, 1830. Wife was (1) Phoebe Orvis (2) Lydia Orvis. 10 children

Pg. 210: JEREMIAH HUNSEY, an early settler in Sullivan Twp., was also a soldier in the Revolutionary Army. He resided in Sullivan Twp. for many years and died at the age of ninety.

Pg. 210: EMMERICH BURLIN, who settled in Richmond township in 1808, was a Revolutionary soldier. He died in 1937, aged eighty-seven yrs.

Pg. 210: BETH CLARK, who came from Wilbraham, Massachusetts, in 1814, and settled in Richmond Township, was a Revolutionary Soldier and carried a musket under Washington.

Pg. 210: DRAGON ISAAC LOUNSBURY, born December 21, 1757, served in the Revolutionary army. He came to Tioga county in 1818 and settled at Canceo Camp, where he died April 4, 1951, aged ninety-four years.

Pg. 209: MAJOR EMMERICH RYPLIN, who came from Coopers town, New York, in 1817, and settled in Lamb's Creek, served in the Continental army with the rank of major. After coming to Tioga county he was appointed Justice of the Peace.

Pg. 210 & 1055: LIEUT. JACOB ALLEN, who was born in Massachusetts in 1763, entered the Continental Army as an aide-de-camp to his father, who was killed in the early part of the war. Young Allen remained in the service to the close and was promoted to the rank of lieutenant. He came from Mass. in 1818 and settled near Mansfield where he died Dec. 11, 1836, aged seventy-three years.

Pg. 210, 361 & 765: PETER SHUMWAY, a native of Massachusetts, came to Tioga County about 1805, and located at Mansfield. A year later he removed to Charleston Township, and settled on Shumway Hill. He was a veteran of the Revolution, serving nearly seven years. There is now in the possession of his grandson, Peter S. Shumway, of Wellsboro, the original discharge received by him, June 9, 1783. This rare and highly-prized relic shows that Peter Shumway was a "Soldier of the Fourth Massachusetts regiment," that he "faithfully served the United States six years and three months," having "enlisted for the war only." John Trumbull, Jr., certified that it was "given at headquarters by His Excellency's command." It was signed by Washington himself, the signature, "Go Washington," being clear, bold and distinct. It bears unmistakable evidence of genuineness. Another high officer, whose name has become dimmed by age, certified that "the above PETER SHUMWAY, soldier, has been honored with a badge of merit, for six years' faithful service," and "John M. Davis, adjutant," certifies that it is "registered in the books of the regiment."

This venerable relic of Revolutionary days, although 114 years old, is in fair state of preservation, and with care will easily last another century. Inclosed in the same frame with the discharge are two specimens of "Massachusetts Bay" paper money of the time, coarse-grained and antique in design. One bill is of the denomination of \$8; the other No. 59,222, and calls for 365, "in gold or silver." In the contemplation of these old documents one's mind is carried back to "the time that tried men's souls"-the days that were dark and gloomy, and when the cause of liberty trembled in the balance.

After Peter Shumway's death in 1833, the discharge passed into the hands of his son, SLEMAN SHUMWAY. He died May 3, 1864. It then became the property of his son, N.P. Shumway. During recent years it has been in the possession of Melvina L. Shumway, wife of Jonathan V. Morgan, and

is now owned by Peter R. Shumway, Wellsboro, a great-grandson of the Peter Shumway to whom it was originally given as an evidence of faithful service in the Revolutionary army. It is an heirloom of inestimable value.

Pg. 211 & 699: COL. JUSTUS DARTT, THE Founder of Dartt Settlement in Charleston Township, where he located in 1811, was a soldier of the Revolution and afterwards a colonel in the Vermont militia. He died in Charleston July 5, 1836, aged eighty-one years. Wife Hannah died 1-14-1844 at 86. There are numerous descendants.

Pg. 211 & 267: ISRAEL GREENLEAF, an early settler and tavern keeper in Wellsboro, was also a Revolutionary Soldier. He died June 1, 1847, aged eighty-two years, and lies buried in the old graveyard on Academy Hill in Wellsboro. Wife Sarah died 3- 8-1840 at 72 yrs. In the same graveyard lies buried JOSEPH THOMPSON, another Revolutionary Soldier, who died November 23, 1842, aged eighty-five years. This graveyard, having been abandoned many years ago, has become overgrown with brush and brambles, and the graves of these two heroes are sadly neglected.

Pg. 766: JOSEPH THOMPSON, born Stonington, Conn. Jan. 5, 1757, youngest of 18 children. Served in Rev. in Conn. Later came to Otsego Co., N.Y. & there m. Catherine Coates who bore him these children: Joseph; Alanson; Lucretia who m. James Kimball; Cynthia; Lorinda who m. Col. Hiram Freshorn; and Alben. Died 11-23-1842 and is buried Academy Hill Cemetery, Wellsboro. Aged 85 yrs.

Pg. 211 & 935: DRAGON RICHARD ELLIS, a native of Ashfield, Mass., served in the Revolution army. He settled in Delmar Twp. in 1811 and died in Ellisburg, Potter County, in 1841. Born 12-20-1760 m. sisters (1) Eunice Chilson (2) her sister.

Pg. 211, 215 & 267: ROYAL COLE, who settled in Wellsboro about 1818, and who became a well-known and prominent citizen, was a veteran of both the Revolutionary War and the War of 1812. He died in Wellsboro, July 4, 1849, in his ninetieth year.

Pg. 211 & 736: ROBERT STEELE, SR., was born in Carlisle, Pa., about 1766. He served a short time in the Revolutionary army. In 1805 he came to Tioga county and was the first settler on the site of "Big Meadows," now Ansonia. He died at the home of his son Robert in Delmar Twp. in 1836. Left nine chn: John; James; Matilda; Ephraim; Henry; Elizabeth; Robert; Polly and William.

Pg. 211: ROBERT CAMPBELL, a pioneer of Morris Twp., enlisted in the Continental Army when only sixteen years of age, and served under Washington. He lies buried at Cassel, Lycoming Co., Pa. He was one of the sons of SAMUEL CAMPBELL, who had served in the French and Indian War, and also the Revolution. His wife was RACHEL MORRISON, whose father George Morrison, was killed early in the Revolutionary War on the frontier at Pine Creek.

Pg. 267: REBECCA JACKSON, court crier. Buried Academy Hill Cem. Grandfather of Mary Emily Jackson, poetess.

Mr. Lloyd was then commanded to get out of the cutter and hold up his hands. Two men then held the frightened horse while a third went through Mr. Lloyd's pockets. They secured about five dollars in change, and after roundly cursing him for not having more money permitted him to get back in his cutter and drive on. Fortunately just before reaching the bridge Mr. Lloyd had taken his pocket book from his pocket and placed it under the cushion of the cutter seat, and is just the amount ahead. He has frequently traveled over this road at night carrying large amounts of money and this is his first experience of this character.

JOHN and SARAH BLACKWELL, Nallsworth, Glostershire, England and ENOCH BLACKWELL, SR. of Haven Parish, Glostershire, England, children of Enoch, Sr.; WILLIAM Blackwell, JOHN, NANCY, PHOEBE, HANNAH, SARAH, and ENOCH, half brother.

Children of John and Sarah, ENOCH, SR., THOMAS, PEPPER, and JOSHUA:

Children of Joshua and John H. Blackwell, GEORGE, ENOCH the 3rd and Amelia;

Children of Enoch the 3rd, WILLIAM BUSH BLACKWELL, GEORGE A., SPENCER W., EDWARD S., CHRISTINE C. These all came over in 1804. Sailed from Bristol April 2nd, landed at Philadelphia, May 17th. Along with the company was a lad 13 yrs. old, THOMAS LLOYD and a lady by name SARAH LUGG. She became the wife of THOMAS CHURCH and later the wife of Enoch Blackwell, Sr. This Blackwell, Sr. This company of new purchased 12,000 acres of land in the counties of Tioga and Lycoming and paid \$1200 for it. A Presbyterian minister, JOHN HAY, was the leader. In Spring of 1805 they started for their new homes and reached there in safety and commenced living in their darkness kind of wilderness, a forest of the largest kind of timber practically pine and hemlock. They worked and cleared up several farms. After several years, they became discontented and began to leave. Their place was named English Settlement, its name today Oregon Hill. I think the first to leave was Enoch, Sr. He went to Pine Creek (where Blackwell is today) and purchased 400 acres of land, and commenced to clear it up and lumbered. This was Spring of 1810. He farmed and lumbered till Spring of 1816, and went down the river with his lumber and was taken sick at Jersey Shore and died, age 53. WILLIAM was the oldest son, and JOHN, NANCY, HANNAH, PHOEBE and SARAH. NANCY married a man by name of HENRY TOMB and died at Dantz Run on Pine Creek. HANNAH married a Haylock and they went West. SARAH MARRIED JOHN GAMEBLE of Jersey Shore. PHOEBE married a man by the name of Shearer and went to Illinois. ENOCH, half-brother, settled at Nelson, Tioga Co.

JOHN went to Bradford, Bradford County, west of Burlington and remained until he died. JOSHUA went to Jersey Shore. I cannot name his children. PETER, I think, died at English Settlement. WILLIAM, son of ENOCH, SR., remained at Blackwell's until he died December 3, 1859. Children of William are; MARY ANN, GEORGE, ENOCH, JOHN M., SARAH, WILLIAM, JAMES. I am the only one left and am 74 years old 16 of September.

Author James Blackwell died May 26, 1917, born March 30, 1828.

Mrs. Skinner lost a husband, a brother and two sons in the American Revolution; She with her family was a resident of Wyoming, at the massacre of its inhabitants by Brandt, the Indians and Tories. Her two sons fell beneath the tomahawk but the Mother almost by miracle escaped with six of the children. Her son-in-law was the only one that escaped out of 20 that threw themselves in the River and attempted to hide beneath the foliage, all were massacred.
