



Finding Aids: Unlocking a Norfolk City Directory

This brief finding aid is meant to help you get the best use from city directories of past and present. City Directories have been published since the late 1700s in America. The directories were the phone books of their day! 1801 is the earliest known city directory for the City of Norfolk, Virginia, and an annual directory has been published continuously since that time. Unfortunately, there are few surviving directories from the period between 1801 and 1866. In a typical directory, you will find:

- Alphabetized list of the residents and businesses in a city.
- Street and Avenue directory for the city.
- Classified business directory similar to the yellow pages of current phone books.
- Miscellaneous section containing information about organizations, government, and other entities.
- Advertisements of local businesses and products.





Not all city directories are the same in their content but most contain the sections mentioned above.

These directories are a great tool for researchers and genealogists since their content offers a glimpse into city life and shows a yearly census of its population. They give the location of individual residences and the occupations of citizens. The later directories include spouse information when applicable; this is a great help when researching relatives. Keep in mind that the directories do not include everyone—the canvasser may have missed the individual or business, or the residents may have been absent at the time of the survey.

Tips:

- Note: The 1885 Norfolk City Directory and subsequent directories have a separate Street and Avenue section within the directory.
- Keep in mind the information in city directories is subject to error. Always try to confirm your information from more than one source.
- If the street is not listed in the directory, the street was most likely outside the city limits at that time or not yet developed.
- Individuals with employment listed or name in bold, were generally considered to be in the upper part of Norfolk society, or held a significant position within a business and/or group.
- Check both the alphabetized listing of people and businesses and the street directory for sometimes information can be contradictory. Also check the phone book for that time period when applicable.
- Remember The year listed on the spine and title page for the city directory may contain information compiled the *previous year*. Check the years before and after the date you have.

What is the Sargeant Memorial Room?

Mary Denson Pretlow, Head Librarian of the Norfolk Public Library, established the Sargeant Memorial Room (SMR) in 1927 with only a small assortment of books and historical papers collected by William Henry Sargeant. Sargeant was the first Librarian to be hired by the City of Norfolk in 1897, and he felt very strongly that Norfolk needed a history room devoted to local history and people. The current non-circulating collection includes a variety of books and periodicals about Norfolk and Virginia, as well as Norfolk maps, photographs, high school yearbooks, and city directories for the Hampton Roads region. Nearly 200 years of Norfolk newspapers on microfilm are available in our collection. SMR's genealogy collection encompasses Virginia, North Carolina, Maryland, and other nearby states; the collection includes books, microfilm, and CDs to assist in family research. Today, the Sargeant Memorial Room offers, without doubt, one of Virginia's finest local history and genealogy collections.
