## Infosheet No. 24 Useful sources for genealogists

### Lloyd's Captains' Register

Contrary to popular belief, the Lloyd's Captains' Register was not published by Lloyd's Register. It was compiled from the record of Certificates of Competency and Service issued to masters, kept by the Registrar General of Shipping and Seamen from 1852, in accordance with the Mercantile Marine Act 1850. The Registrar transmitted the details to Lloyd's of London (the other 'Lloyd's') at regular intervals, by special arrangement. The original record, in numerical order of certificate number, is held at The National Archives under class references BT 122 to BT 127.

Lloyd's of London began to publish the *Captains' Register*, listing the information alphabetically by master's name, from 1869. A full collection of these registers, dating to 1947, is held by the Guildhall Library, as part of the Lloyd's Marine Collection.

The Guildhall Library also holds: information relating to ships' voyages and losses; a full collection of *Lloyd's List* dating from 1740; the *Mercantile Navy List*, which carried obituaries for ships' masters around 1864 and Records of the Commissary Court of London (London Division), containing naval and merchant seamen's wills from the late 17<sup>th</sup> Century.

### Census records

Census records for England, Wales, Isle of Man and Channel Islands have been taken every ten years since 1841. Most local and county record offices hold microfilm or microfiche copies of the 1841 to 1901 census returns for their own areas. Census returns can also usually be viewed at Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints' Family History Centres.
