Do you know that from September 1958 to September 1959 we have had 1167 visitors to Judson House and the Museum; that these visitors paid admissions amounting to \$412.80; that this is twice the amount of money taken in for the year 1957 - 1958? We are now on our way to attract many more people who are interested in antiquities dating back to the 17th, 18th and early 19th centuries. The fine publicity which we have had in local, New York and Florida papers, as well as other media, has been a good source of advertising. Visitors during the past summer came from fifteen states and from the District of Columbia, Canada, Bermuda and England.

Another summer we shall have to consider keeping Judson House and the Museum open for at least five days during the week.

Formal Dedication of the Stratford Historical Museum on Sunday, November 8, at 3 p.m.

The members of the Stratford Historical Society will want to make plans to attend this dedication ceremony. It will be a memorable occasion which our members will not want to miss. The memorial plaque stating that the Historical Museum is the gift of Catherine T. Mitchell will be unveiled by Mrs. Frank Scott Bunnell.

Members will be interested in the new exhibits of early American linens which will soon be displayed in the Gun Room. Some of the women have been busily engaged in washing these linens so that they might be preserved for posterity.

November Meeting of the Stratford Historical Society

Kodachromes taken by four of our members will trace the task of removing the intrusions of the early and late 19th century to reveal the original construction of the David Judson House. Cummings, Assistant Director of the Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities, will be our guest speaker. Dr. Cummings was the spark which set off the restoration of Judson House about a year ago. You cannot afford to miss this program. No further notice will be sent.
