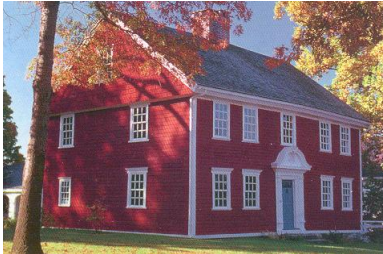

Ah... Spring when Mother Nature comes to life! As our members should expect it's the same for the Society in many ways. Our attention turns to the indoors and the outdoors. The doors to the Judson House and Catharine B. Mitchell Museum were opened during April and May for school tours to 5th grades focusing on the Revolutionary War period. In the fall, 3rd grade students will gain some experience about the type of life that Stratford townspeople endured during early Colonial days. This very active tour schedule is made possible by the dedicated team of Docents, ten of which were added by Dolores Hctor's 2012 recruitment effort, who were trained in time to participate.

The Constitution/Bylaws Review Committee completed their review. A draft copy with their proposed amendments was distributed to the Governing Board at the April 30 meeting. A review of the document was initiated and will be resumed at the June 25 meeting. The Board was tasked to continue their independent review during the interim and feedback comments to the Committee. We welcome any nominations or comments from the Society's members.

Tours for the general public will begin on Main Street Festival Day, Saturday June 2 and remain open on Wednesdays and Sundays through Sunday October 26.

The Society has reserved space at the Main Street Festival Day, at which we expect to promote the opening of the Judson House and Museum and to encourage Festival goers to take advantage of the Open House. Members are invited to ask and answer questions about the Society that the public may have.

An added attraction for our Main Street Festival Day: I am very pleased to announce that several costumes which were used in Shakespearean plays at the Theatre will be on display in the Museum. Visitors will have the unique opportunity to view them throughout the season. We owe thanks to the Stratford Arts Commission for entrusting the Society with the costumes that for quite some time they have voluntarily served as custodians.

BUMPER CROP

Want to see a Bumper Crop? Come on down to Judson House and have a look at the gardens - in the dooryard, the courtyard in back and the raised beds in front. There is an amazing collection of flourishing plants all labeled.

Credit for this lovely scene goes to Pat Casenhiser, Master Gardener, in charge of selecting and planting specimens, Lori Laput in charge of maintenance and Dolores Hctor, coordinator. As if that were not enough, credit also goes to Bumper Crop, an organic mix guaranteed to get results (available at Ganim's Garden Center on the Post Road in Fairfield). You, too, can have a Bumper Crop!

Another March

Another March, another docent training course and another cadre of talented volunteers namely Mistress Betty (Minaudo), Mistress Robin (Mojcik) Mistress Lisa (Wierzbicki), Mistress Patty (Siksay), the returning Mistress Arleen (Bernor) as well as Master Dennis (Brunelle), Master Dick (Steele) and Master Dave (McPadden).

Altogether we have thirty working docents and we need every one of them to teach 500 plus fifth graders in the spring about Stratford's part in the American Revolution and 500 plus third graders in the fall about Colonial Life.

The Stratford Historical Society hosts 25 classes of each grade, over 16 tour days in May and October. Generally there are two classes on the same day and each has a two hour tour - an hour in the House and an hour in the Museum with a short visit to the Carriage House in between. The classes then make their way to the Perry House

You are more than welcome to join us. It requires a few hours of instruction, some studying, some practice and a few hours of giving tours twice a year. You would be doing a service to the school children of your community and personal satisfaction in return.

200 YEARS AGO

At the age of 85 years, in 1812, the Honorable DOCTOR WILLIAM SAMUEL JOHNSON signer of the United States Constitution, entered the Fairfield County Superior Court, returning from a 27 year absence, and took a seat at the Bar. Still widely respected as the "father of the bar on Connecticut", he was honored with a proclamation later that week, delivered to him at Mrs. Bulkley's home.

March Meeting

Rick Spencer again entertained society members with a musical walk through the War of 1812, for both the newly minted American views and the British soldiers' perspective.

We were joined at the meeting by District 3 Town Council Representative Matt Catalano and Arts Commission Ed Goodrich, two of the most passionate advocates for the Shakespeare Theater's renaissance, who advised of the project's current status. Mr. Catalano also told of the recovery of a large cache of costumes attributed to the performances at the theatre prior to it closing in 1985. The Theater is a significant part of Stratford's reputation and the Society is pleased to display a small number of the rescued costumes while the Theater's future is considered by the town.
