Aviation course of two miles.

Room enough to make aviation course of three and one-tenth miles, for international races.

Machine shop on grounds, capable of repairing all makes of aeroplanes.

Hangars for aeroplanes.

Grand stand enlarged and capable of accommodating many thousands.

Experimental field for trying out new aeroplanes.

Racing track which may be used for automobiles and motorcycles, or trotting races.
