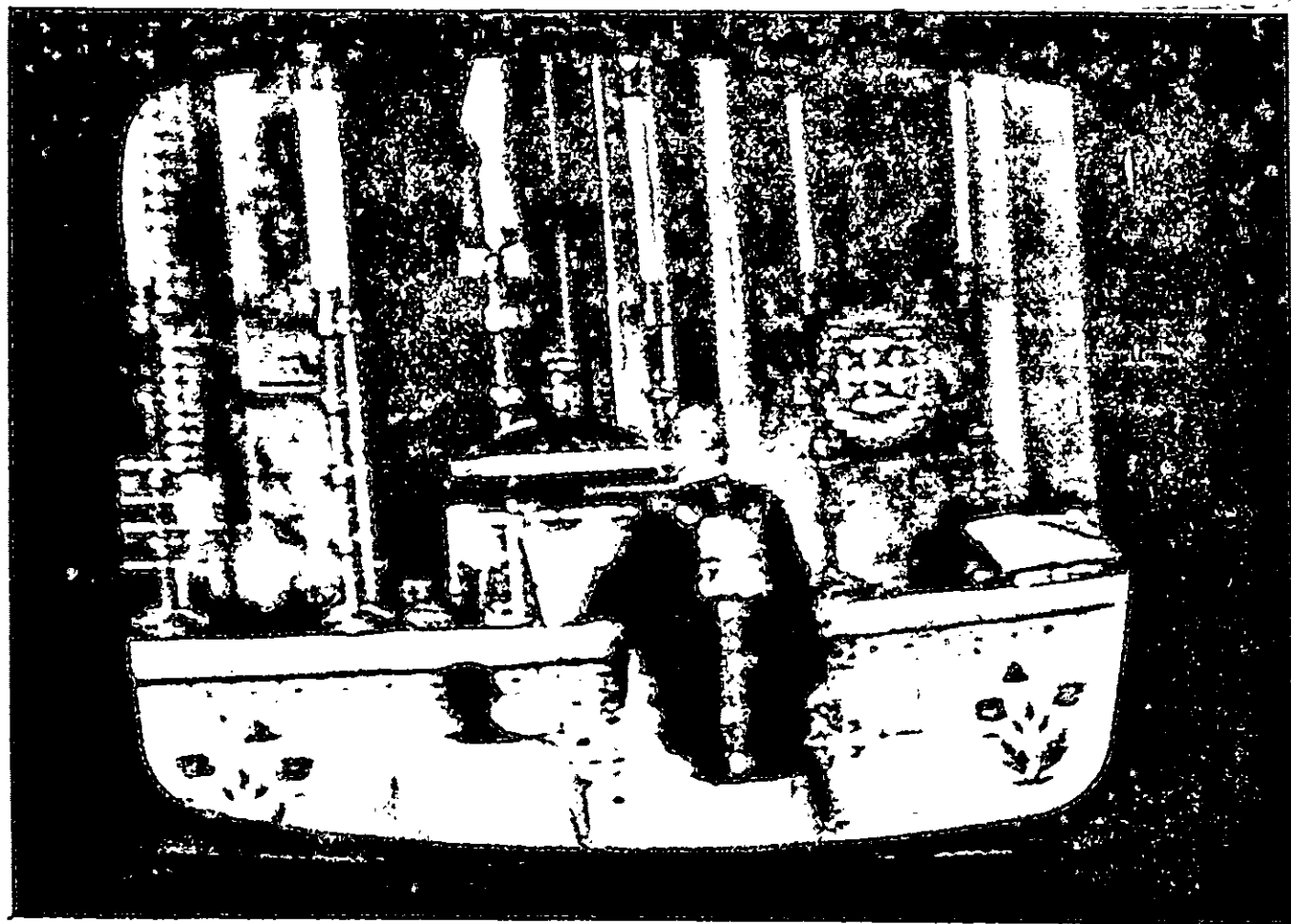




DAVIS JOINS IN MOURNING LOSS OF PRESIDENT

A shocked and incredulous nation still could not believe the president of the United States, John F. Kennedy, had been killed by a sniper's bullet in Dallas, Texas. But the sheer weight of hour after hour of radio and television programs, unfolding the events, made the im-

pact begin to sink in. Offices and schools closed. Stores locked their doors Monday morning during the funeral services. As the nation watched the cortege and services on television, little else moved.
