

# School Enrollment Up 1900 In Year

First day enrollments in the schools of Davis county this year showed an increase of nearly 1900 over the first day of last year.

AT THE CLOSE of school on Tuesday, Aug. 28, there were 22,214 students registered in the 35 schools of the district. Last year, on the first day there were 20,327 enrolled and by the end of the 1961-62 school year, there were 20,770.

"This year we again expect to gain another three or four hundred before the school year ends," Supt. G. Harold Holt said. "In fact, these 'first day' figures are expected to be quite a bit lower than those we tabulate at the end of the first week of school this year," he added.

HE SAID there was an 8.57 percent enrollment increase in the elementary grades and a 10.73 percent increase on the secondary level. One of the biggest birth rates in recent years was in 1946-47 and the children born during those two years are now swelling the enrollment of the tenth and

11th grades.

In the tenth grade (sophomore class) there were 1,746 enrolled the first day of school and in the 11th grade (junior

class) there were 1,212 enrolled.

THE GRADE with the most pupils registering was the second grade with 2,434 followed closely by the first grade in which 2,430 students registered.

The class with the fewest students is the senior class. From the three high schools in the county, there are only 979 students registered. Bountiful High enrolled 437 seniors; Clearfield High, 295 and Davis High, 247 seniors.

BOUNTIFUL High has a total enrollment of 1,690; Clearfield High, 1,608 and Davis High, 1,115 students.

South Davis Junior High also had the highest enrollment of the five junior high schools in the district. Total enrollment there was 1102. Next was Bountiful Junior, 928; North Davis Junior, 899; Central, 884; and Kaysville, 750. Total enrollment for all junior highs is 4,563 — and for all secondary schools, 8,976. Total enrollment in the elementary schools is 13,181. There are also 57 students who are homebound or enrolled in the special education school.

THE ELEMENTARY school with the largest enrollment is the Doxey school in Sunset with an enrollment of 742. Highest in the Bountiful area is the Bountiful Elementary with an enrollment of 723, followed by the Tolman school with 706 students registered. The newest school in the district, the Valley View, which opened for the first time this fall, has an enrollment of 657, sixth from the highest.

This is the breakdown on total district enrollment in each grade; 1st, 2,430; 2nd, 2,434; 3rd, 2298; 4th, 2176; 5th, 1986; 6th, 1857; 7th, 1780; 8th, 1674; 9th, 1585 10th, 1746; 11th, 1212 and 12th, 979.

TOTAL enrollments at elementary schools affecting students from Farmington south, in the district are: Adelaide, 666; Boulton, 654; Bountiful Elementary, 723; Centerville, 354; Farmington, 341; Holbrook, 512; South Bountiful, 309; Stoker, 480; Taylor, 580; Tolman, 706; Valley View, 657; and West Bountiful, 277.
