

Adelaide PTA Plans Civil Defense Classes

Another series of civil defense classes, under the direction of the Adelaide PTA, has been started at the Adelaide school, held Thursday evenings at 7:30 p.m., in the multipurpose room. Mrs. Claude Jenkins, PTA civil defense director, is directing the seven classes. She has announced that she will introduce specially trained personnel to discuss the different subjects.

IN VIEW OF the present international and Cuban crises, it appears more important than ever for every parent to be fully qualified to handle his family situation in the event of an atomic crisis. Every citizen is urged to attend these classes. While these studies are "old stuff" to some in the area, still the great proportion of citizens have only vague and misconstrued opinions on what should be the proper method used in emergency measures.

The class of Oct. 25, attended by 35 parents, covered "Radioactive Fallout and Shelter." Class No. 2, Nov. 1, studied "Hygiene Sanitation

and Vermin Control" and "Water and Food".

FUTURE CLASSES are Nov. 7, "Shock" and "Bleeding and Bandaging"; Nov. 15, "Artificial Respiration" and "Fractures and Splinting"; Nov. 19, "Transportation of the Sick and Injured" and "Burns"; Nov. 29, "Nursing Care of the Sick and Injured" and "Infant and Child Care"; and the last class, Dec. 6, "Emergency Childbirth" and "Review and Examinations".

Further information urged by the civil defense directors, pertaining to school children, is as follows: "If we receive an 'attack' signal from civil defense headquarters, we must keep the children in school. If we receive an 'attack alert' signal, we must send the children home. Please instruct them to get home as quickly as possible, if the 'attack alert' signal is given. In either case, please do not come to the school after your children. We will get them home as soon as we possibly can. Also, please instruct your children on where to go if you are not at home." rw
