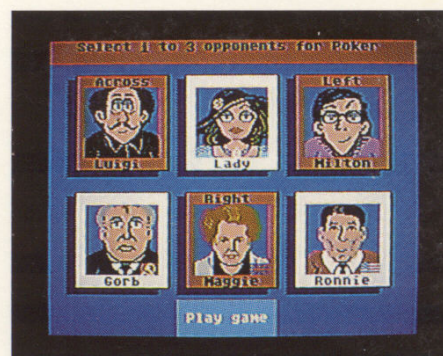
And they won't stink up the joint with stogies.

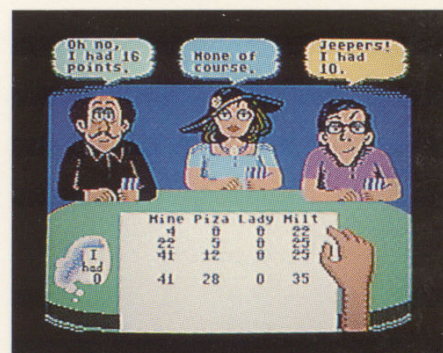
Accolade's Card Sharks. When your friends fold, the Sharks are ready to play.
