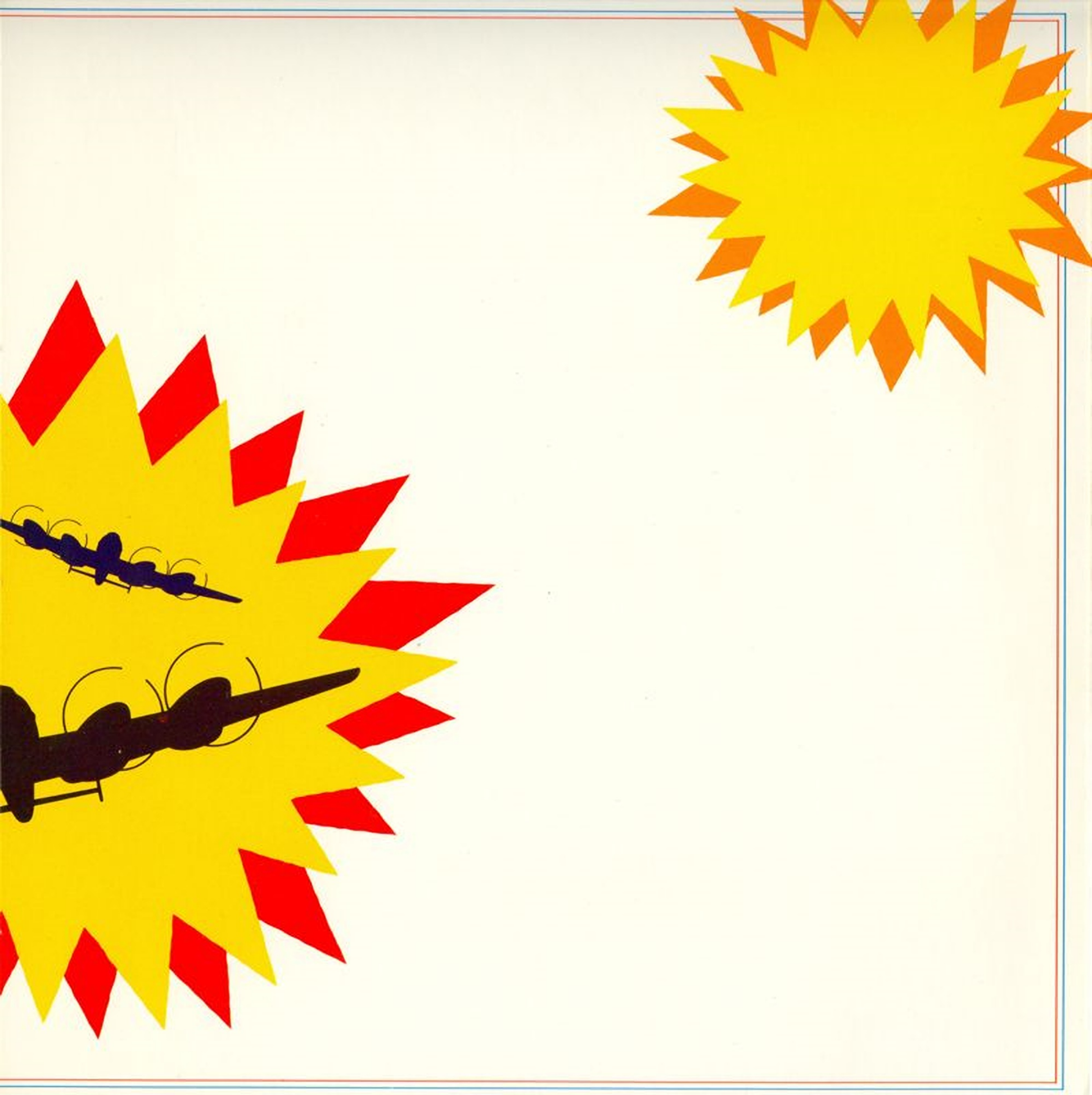

Right Stuff!

Are you made of the same strong, resourceful stuff as Wing Commander Gibson? There's only one way to find out.

Your targets are the great power dams of the Eder, the Sorpe, and the Moehne deep inside Nazi Germany. The stakes are high. If these monstrous dams can be breached, millions of tons of water will flood the Ruhr, cutting off vital water

supplies to steelworks, and flooding factories, power stations and farmlands. If this can be done, the resulting chaos will virtually cripple the supposedly unstoppable German war machine.

It happened once, will it happen again?

The successful conclusion of this raid on May 16th, 1943 is now legendary. It remains to be seen whether you can do it again.

10,000 lb. bomb.

In a Lancaster Bomber, battle-proven and powered by four awesome Rolls Royce Merlin engines, you will carry a 10,000-pound cylindrical steel monster designed to skip over the surface of the water, sink like a rock behind the dam, and explode.



At your command you will have superb graphics and sound, realistic joystick control, pilot's screen and indicators, multiple screen navigator maps, front and rear gunner screens, bomb sighting screens, engineer's indicators and much, much more.

Make no mistake about it, the whole burden of the raid rests on you. You do the jobs of Wing Commander Gibson and all seven crew members as well.

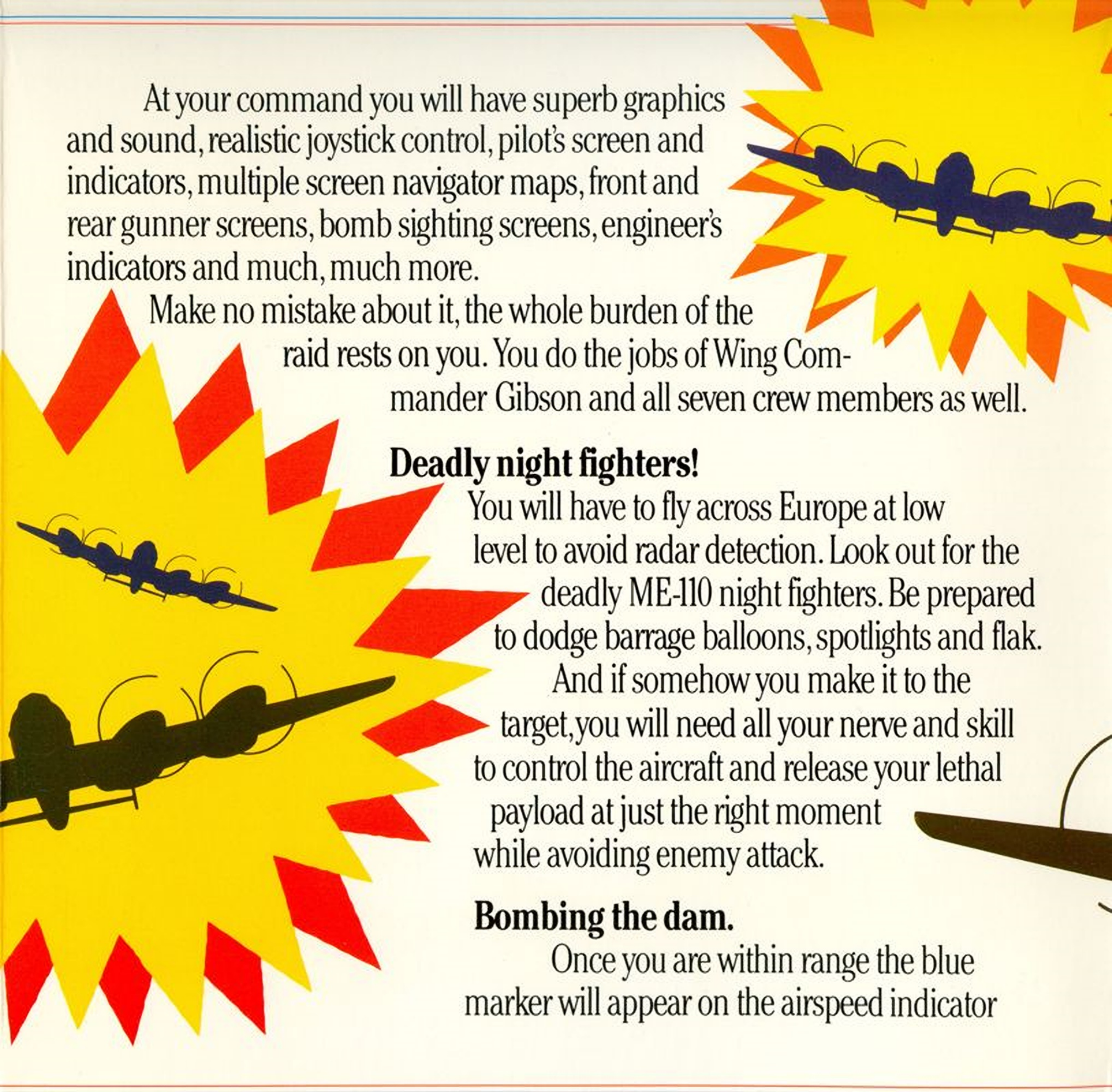
Deadly night fighters!

You will have to fly across Europe at low level to avoid radar detection. Look out for the deadly ME-110 night fighters. Be prepared to dodge barrage balloons, spotlights and flak.

And if somehow you make it to the target, you will need all your nerve and skill to control the aircraft and release your lethal payload at just the right moment while avoiding enemy attack.

Bombing the dam.

Once you are within range the blue marker will appear on the airspeed indicator

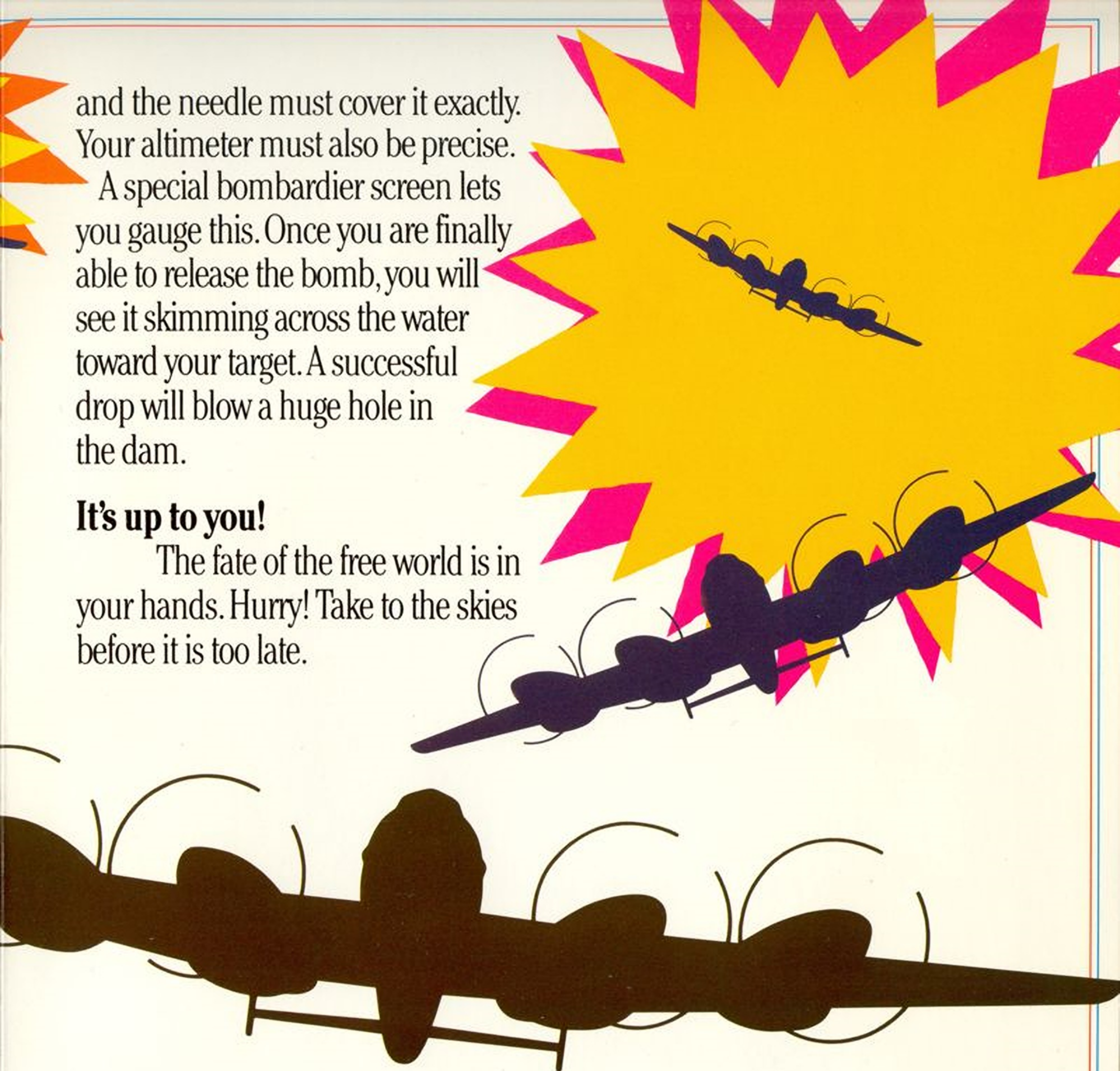


and the needle must cover it exactly.
Your altimeter must also be precise.

A special bombardier screen lets
you gauge this. Once you are finally
able to release the bomb, you will
see it skimming across the water
toward your target. A successful
drop will blow a huge hole in
the dam.

before it is too late.





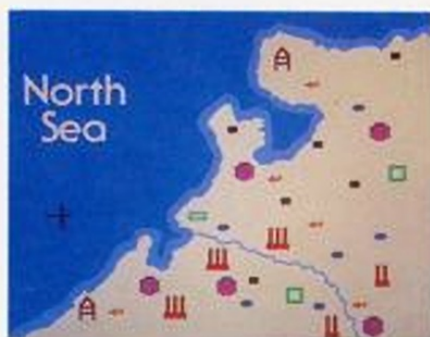
You are about to undertake the most daring R.A.F. bombing mission of World War II. A mission so perilous it would have almost certainly failed if not for the extraordinary skill and daring of Wing Commander Guy Gibson.

Reality will sink in immediately once you see the full cockpit rendition in front of you.

More than a game, this is a real mission with a very real objective! In fact, this is a more exciting, more realistic flight simulator with more real action than you have ever experienced. Your palms will sweat as you hold tightly to the joystick, forced to fend off one attack after another with split-second timing on the way to your appointed target.



This pilot screen is like no other flight simulator. The joystick control behaves like a real Lancaster Bomber, on your midnight mission across Nazi Germany. You'll need all the skills at your command to master the complex instrument panel, plus nerves of steel to survive enemy barrage balloons, search lights and ME-110 night fighters.



A strategic approach to the target is crucial to the success of your mission. To avoid harm's way you will have to carefully scrutinize the map of enemy occupied Europe. Different colored symbols represent the concentration and magnitude of Nazi landmarks: military installations, airports, population centers and industrial complexes. The successful pursuit of your objective will eventually be threatened by each of these landmarks.



Your final run to the dam is the ultimate test, as each parameter—airspeed, distance and altitude—must be set absolutely perfectly for the bomb to destroy the dam. White knuckle time. One wrong move here, even the slightest miscalculation, and the mission will literally self-destruct.

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
