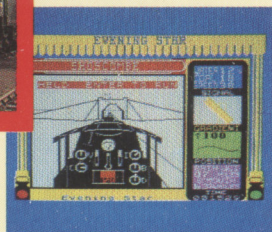

On the 8th September 1962 the "Evening Star", one of the most powerful steam locomotives of the British Railways fleet, pulled the "Pines Express" from Bournemouth to Bath and back. This was the last time this train took the route over the Somerset and Dorset line to Bath, it being subsequently diverted via Reading and Basingstoke. This diversion of traffic from the Somerset and Dorset line sealed the demise of the line which was closed in 1966.
