

JACK NICKLAUS PRESENTS THE MAJOR CHAMPIONSHIP COURSES OF 1989™

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U.S. Open Championship, June 15-18 OAK HILL COUNTRY CLUB, Rochester, New York

In a word, tough. The first hole — Ben Hogan called it the toughest opening hole he had ever faced — sets the tone for the entire course: long, built for drivers, with a small elevated green jealously guarded by encroaching trees, expertly positioned bunkers and a creek. This is Oak Hill's fourth major — three Opens and the 1980 PGA — the latter won by Jack Nicklaus by seven strokes, the largest margin ever in the history of that championship.

British Championship Open, July 20-23 ROYAL TROON GOLF CLUB, Troon, Scotland

It's the sixth Open for this classic links course, one of the most venerable championship tests in Britain since 1888. Tradition aside, the course is very fine — with the longest (577 yards) and shortest (123 yards) holes in British championship play, huge sandhills, heather and gorse, a stone wall, the sea, and four sinister finishing holes. "As much by skill as by strength" goes the club motto. Which is precisely the strategy Jack used here in the '73 Open to set the course record 65.

PGA Championship, August 10-13 KEMPER LAKES GOLF CLUB, Hawthorn Woods, Illinois

The second youngest course (10 years old), and only the third public course, selected to host the prestigious PGA. And a great vacation spot — for a duck. Built on 270 acres with lakes occupying 125 of them. Water comes into play on 11 holes and must be carried on eight shots. There's barely room enough for the 57 sand bunkers. This is the first major played here, but it won't be the last. So intimidating, even par always contends and often wins. How hard is it? The course record is 70.

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Instructions for IBM PC and Tandy

- 1 Use the standard DOS procedure (check your computer manual if you need more info) to make a backup copy of the Championship Courses before you use it. Label your backup disk **Major Championship Courses of 1989** and put your original away for safekeeping.
- 2 Boot up **Jack Nicklaus' Greatest 18 Holes of Major Championship Golf** as you would normally, then when prompted to insert a course disk, replace the disk in the drive with the Championship Courses disk. You can now choose to play any of the three courses: Royal Troon, Oak Hill, or Kemper Lakes.
 - If you have the 3.5" version, boot your **Greatest 18** disk as you would normally. When the course options appear, replace the disk in the drive with the Championship Courses disk and press the **space bar**.
- 3 After you choose one of these courses, an overhead view of one of the holes appears on screen. To pass this screen, type the number of the illustration on the new Jack Nicklaus 1989 Course Sheet that is identical to the hole on your screen. Now you're ready to set up a match.

Instructions for Commodore 64/128

- 1 Boot up **Jack Nicklaus' Greatest 18 Holes of Major Championship Golf** as you would normally, then when prompted to insert a course disk, replace the disk in the drive with the Championship Courses disk. Put it in either label side up or down, depending on which course you want to play:
 - To play either Oak Hill or Kemper Lakes, put the disk in label side up, and when prompted, press the number beside the course you want to play, and that course will load automatically.
 - To play Royal Troon, put the disk in label side down and press the **fire button**. The course will load automatically.
- 2 After you choose one of these courses, an overhead view of one of the holes appears on screen. To pass this screen, type the number of the illustration on the new Jack Nicklaus 1989 Course Sheet that is identical to the hole on your screen. Now you're ready to set up a match.
