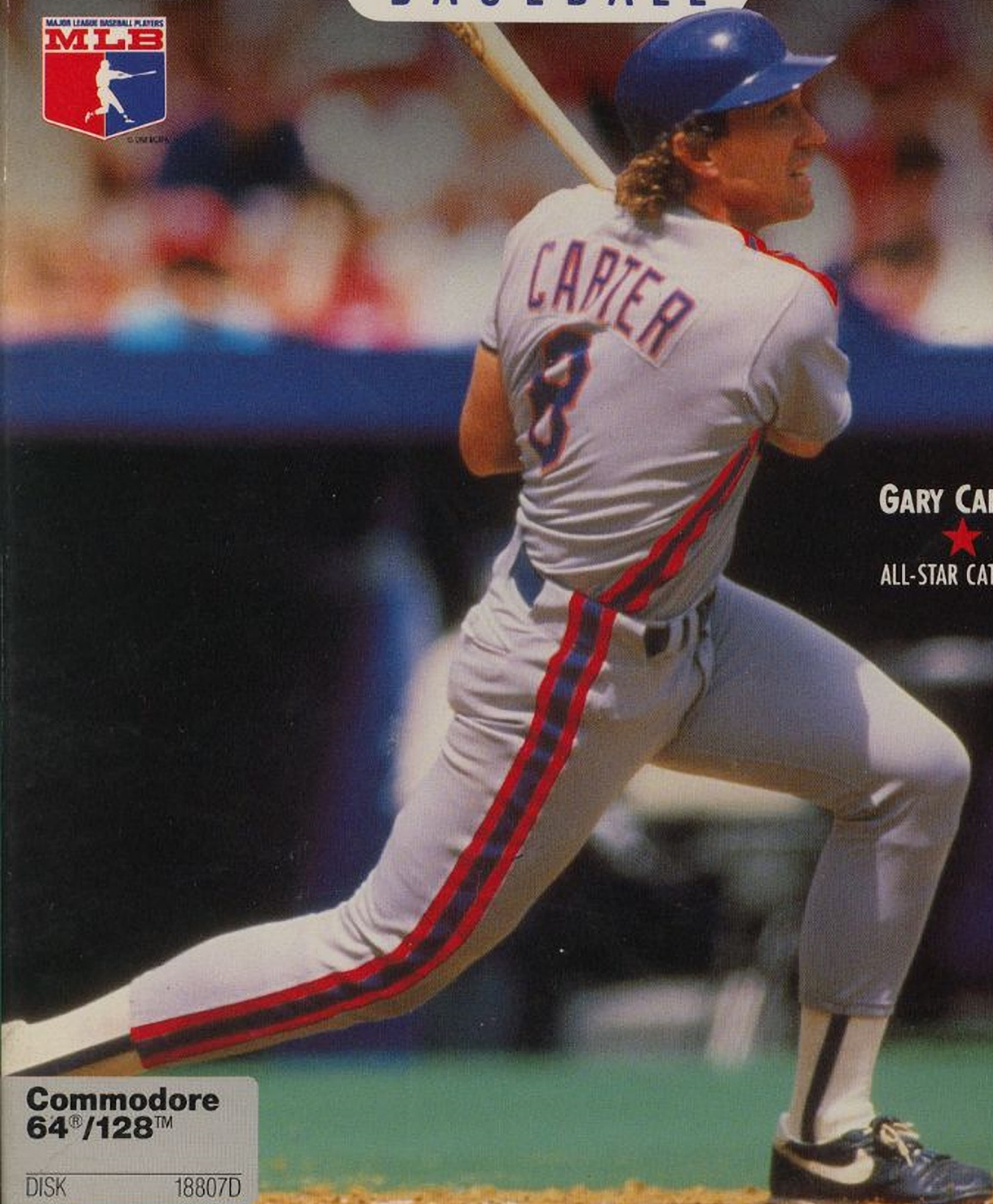

Slugging percentages. Stolen bases. Fielding ranges. Earned run averages. Choose your line-up to take advantage of your player's speed and power.

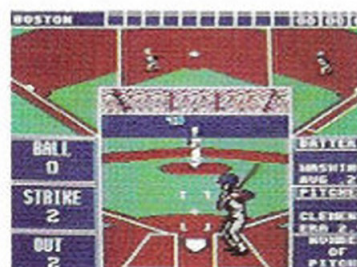
But enough about the numbers, let's play ball.

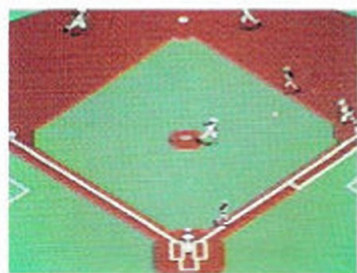
There are split second plays to react to and multiple screens to keep you in the action at all times. Even a box score at the end of the game.

Now, play ball.

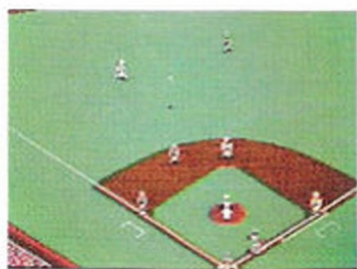
- ▶ Choose line-ups from over 150 past baseball greats and from players of 26 teams. Or create your dream team by trading and/or drafting.
