of do.**

$$\mathbf{d} + \mathbf{id} = \mathbf{did}$$

Do	Did	Done
<p>Present tense</p> <p>To perform an action.</p> 	<p>Past tense.</p> <p>An action that has already happened.</p> 	<p>Past participle.</p> <p>We add an auxiliary verb.</p> 
<p><u>For example:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• I do the laundry.• They do their work.• She does the dishes.	<p><u>For example:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• He did the laundry.• You did your work.• We did the dishes.	<p><u>For example:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• I have done the dishes.• He has done the work.

Verb: do



Do means: to perform an action

V1	V2	V3	V4
Do	Did	Done	Doing

Synonym: carry out, undertake, discharge, execute

Examples:

- 1) **Do** well is better than say well.
- 2) What **did** you get for your birthday?
- 3) Nothing is ever **done** in a hurry.
