

# Phrasal Verb **keep away**

To avoid, prevent from coming near.



He struggles with discipline;  
keep *food* away from him.

Phrasal Verb **keep down**

**Not vomiting.**



**He was sick; he couldn't  
keep *anything* down.**

# Phrasal Verb **keep off**

To not touch.




Please, *keep off* the grass.



# Phrasal Verb **keep on**

To continue.

# Phrasal Verb **keep up**

**Keep pace (or even ahead).**

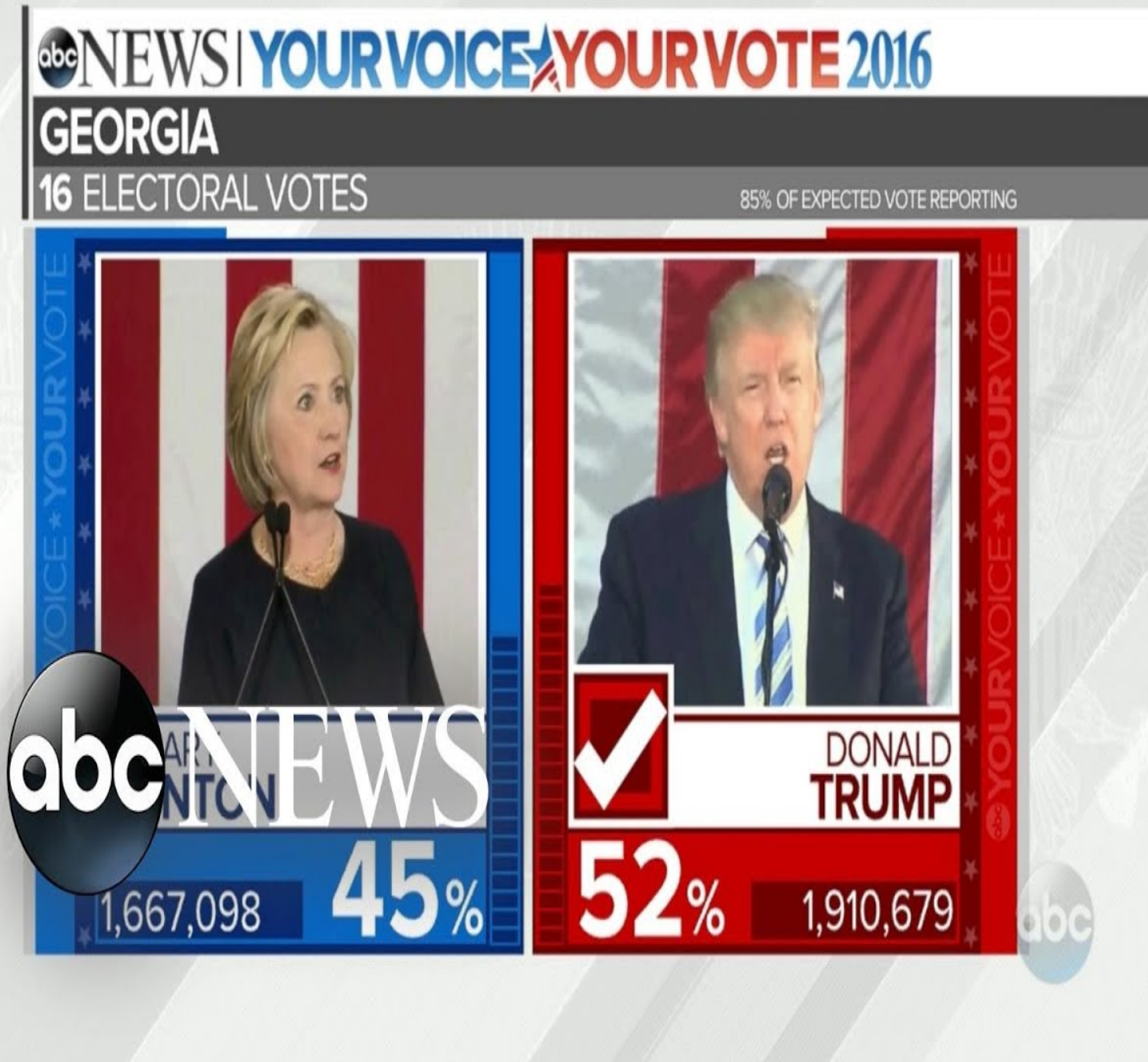


**He may not keep up with most of the runners, but give the guy credit for trying.**



# Phrasal Verb **keep up**

**Knowledge of the current news.**



**Do you keep up with politics?**



Phrasal Verb **keep up**  
To avoid sleep.



Reading a book always  
keeps *me* up.

# Phrasal Verb **keep to myself**

**To avoid people.**



**That place was crowded;  
I rather keep to myself.**
