

Phrasal Verb **give away**

A donation or a gift.



**My boss *gave away* a
Hot Lips Face Heater to
the employee of the month.**

Phrasal Verb **give away**

To unintentionally reveal something.



**Every time he lies,
his facial expressions
gives *himself* away.**

Phrasal Verb **give back**
To return something.



**Has anyone seen my gas
powered flashlight?
If you have it, give *it* back.**

Phrasal Verb **give back**
To donate (money, food, time, etc).



They give back to the
community by cleaning it up.

Phrasal Verb **give in**
To collapse.



**Too much weight will
cause the roof to give in.**

The Metrodome collapsed in 2010,
just like the Vikings 6-10 season.

Phrasal Verb **give in**

To submit, no longer fight an urge
(cave in).



Yes, I *gave in* and ate the
Kat Kot I was saving for
tomorrow!

Phrasal Verb **give off**

**To produce a smell, heat, light,
smoke, etc.**



He gives off a strange smell.

Phrasal Verb **give out**

To stop working.

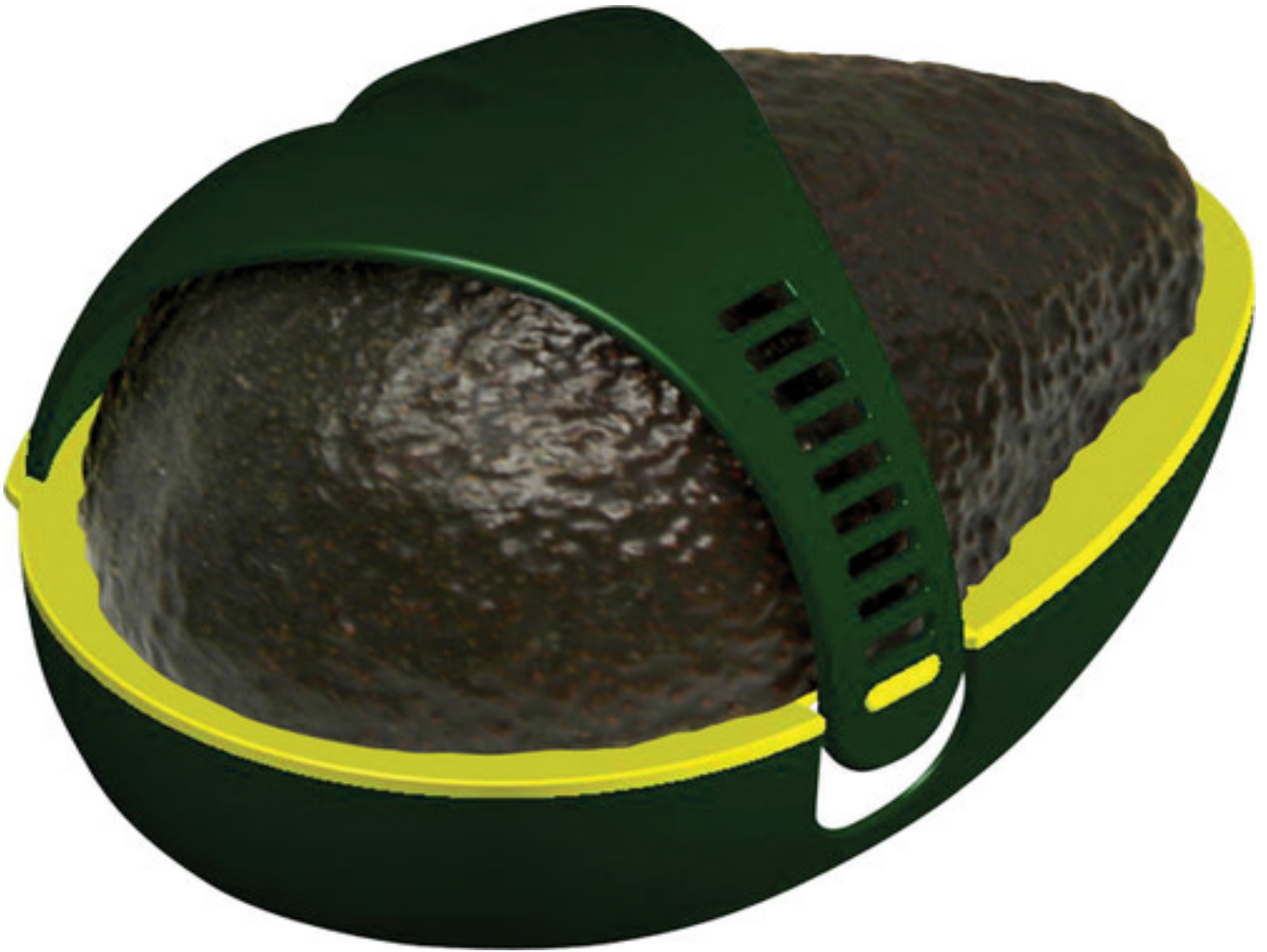


How did his air conditioned shoes give out?

Phrasal Verb **give out**

To distribute.



**Please help me give out
the avocado holders.**

In this case, give out can be substituted with hand out or pass out.

Phrasal Verb **give it up for**

To applaud (clap hands).



Please give it up for ...
a pregnant avocado.

Phrasal Verb **give up**

To stop, quit.



I hope he *gives up* smoking
before kindergarten.

Phrasal Verb **give up**
To surrender.



You, with the 13 items in the
12 items or fewer lane,
give up.

Phrasal Verb **give up**
To vacate, relinquish.



A polite man will always
give up his seat for a lady.

Phrasal Verb **give up**

To admit defeat.



He *gave up* before the play ended.
