Due to is an adjective Because of is an adverb

Due to modifies nouns and pronouns Because of modifies verbs, adjective, and clauses

Due to follows some form of the *be* verb Because of usually follows a clause

Due to can be replaced by *caused by*  Because of can be replaced by *owing* to

#### **DUE TO VS. BECAUSE OF**

"due to" (adjective) must follow a noun "because of" (adverb) modifies a verb



#### due to = caused by


Let's make this simple by replacing due to with caused by.

The accident was due to the heavy snow.

The accident was caused by the heavy snow.

### because of = caused by

Correct: The bus was late because of a flat tire.




Incorrect: The bus was late caused by a flat tire.


Correct: The bus was late on account of a flat tire.

(We can replace because of with on account of)

Some grammar guides say due to and because of are interchangeable.
