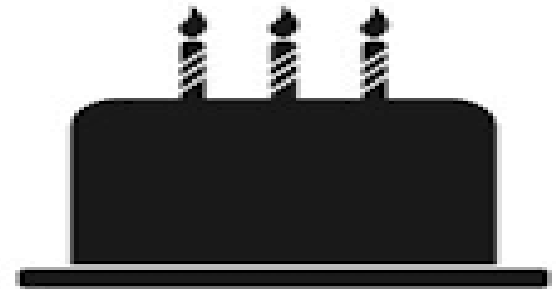

#31 **or** (conjunction)

Used to link choices.

Do you want
cake



or
ice cream?

#32 **for** (conjunction)

He was sad,
for she made
him cry.



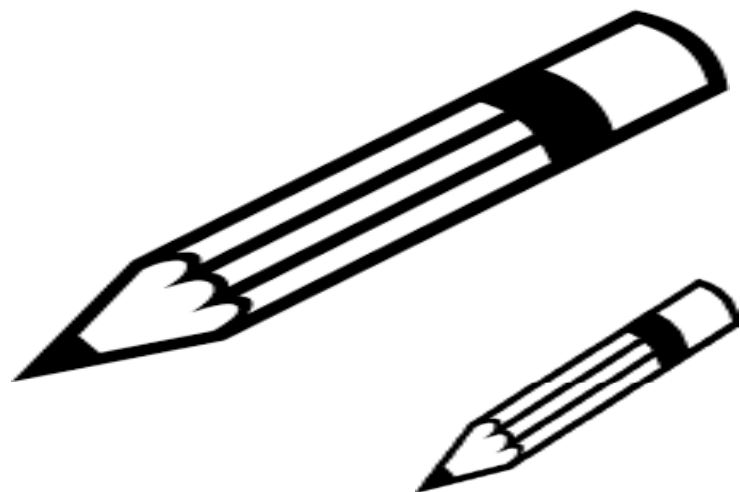
(preposition) I have a present for you.

Many definitions, such as distance or time (for a while), serves a purpose (for storage), to give or get (a gift for me), employment (work for), money (paid for), to support or agree (I am for), feelings (happy for), etc.

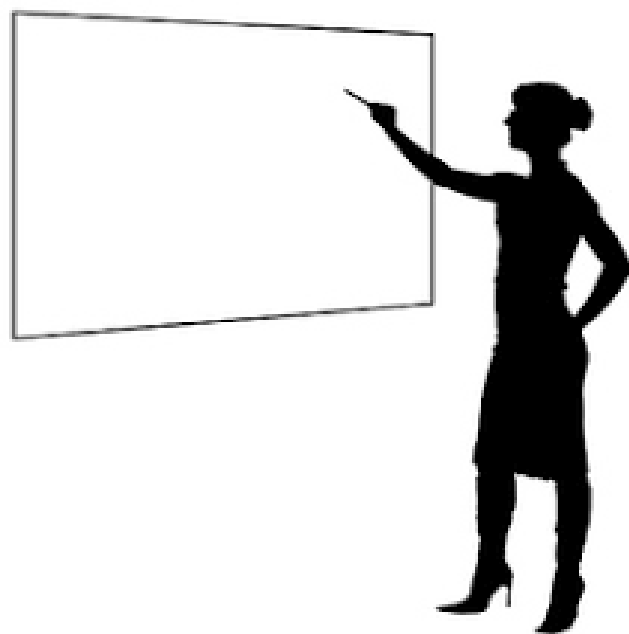
as

#33 **as** (adverb)

Her pencil
is twice as long as
(*comparison*) mine.



(conjunction)
I work as
(*describes role*)
a teacher.



if

#34 if (conjunction)

If- can or will happen if something else happens.

If you want it, work for it.



of

#35 **of** (preposition)

Do not stand within two feet of the window.

This example uses "of" for distance.

The sleeve of my shirt is dirty.

The above example expresses relationship between a part and a whole.

I almost died of laughter.

This example expresses a cause.

it

#36 **it** (pronoun)

3rd person, singular, subject and object pronoun (non-human).

Can refer to something previously mentioned.

I have candy; do you want a piece of it?



so

#37 so (conjunction)

**Read it again,
so you will understand it.**

In this case, *so* means therefore.

This word can be many parts of speech.

also

#38 **also** (adverb)

We also (*in addition*) like chocolate.



(conjunction) He was hungry, also cold.

by

#39 by (preposition)

**This was written by your teacher.
(A completed work.)**

**She arrived by an airplane.
(A means of travel.)**

**(adverb) He lives close by.
Plus many more definitions.**

#40 **try** (verb)

Try it, you may like it.
