


pharmacy

A man from Scotland is wearing a plaid (a checkered, wool cloth) scarf.






portrait

#383 portrait (noun)

Frida Kahlo (1907-1954) painted a self-portrait

(paintings, drawings, photographs, etc. usually from the shoulders up).

Remember, when you film a video on your phone, only upload it to YouTube if it were recorded on landscape, not portrait!



#384 possess (noun)

I <u>possess</u> (have, belonging to) the power to tell silly jokes.





premise

#385 premise (noun)

An idea thought to be true and used as a basis of an argument is a premise.

A premise (what your story is about) will help guide the writer.

Premises (noun) A land with a building on it, "Leave the <u>premises</u> at once."



promise

#386 promise (noun)

It is important to keep a promise

(verbal or in writing about something that will be done).



(verb) He <u>promised</u> to give me chocolates.




proced

#387 proceed (verb)

We will proceed

(continue after a pause, move forward) with the math lesson after a break.

(noun) The proceeds (money) from the fundraiser will help many children.




protein

#388 protein (noun)

Beans, eggs, fish, milk and broccoli are a few sources of protein

(a food or a liquid that helps maintain good health).



punctual

#389 punctual (adjective)

Being punctual (on time) doesn't take talent.

#390 quartz (noun)

Quartz is a hard mineral and usually transparent that can be used to make watches.
