the bread.**

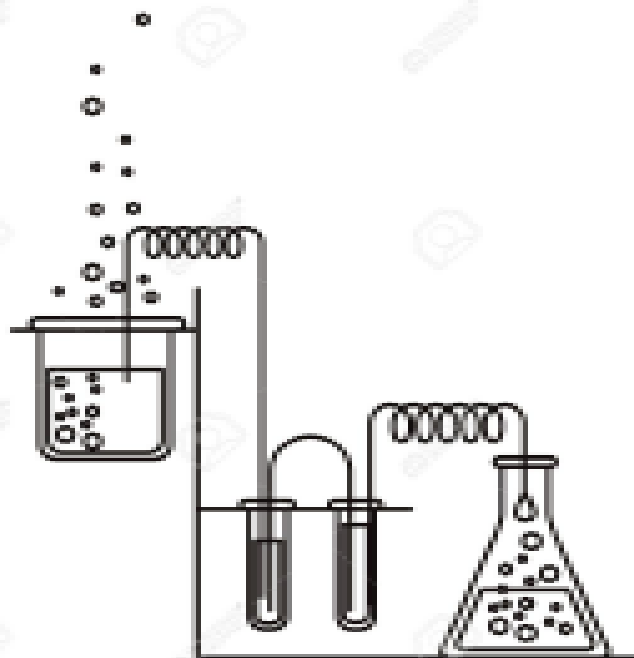

1500 BC (Egypt).**

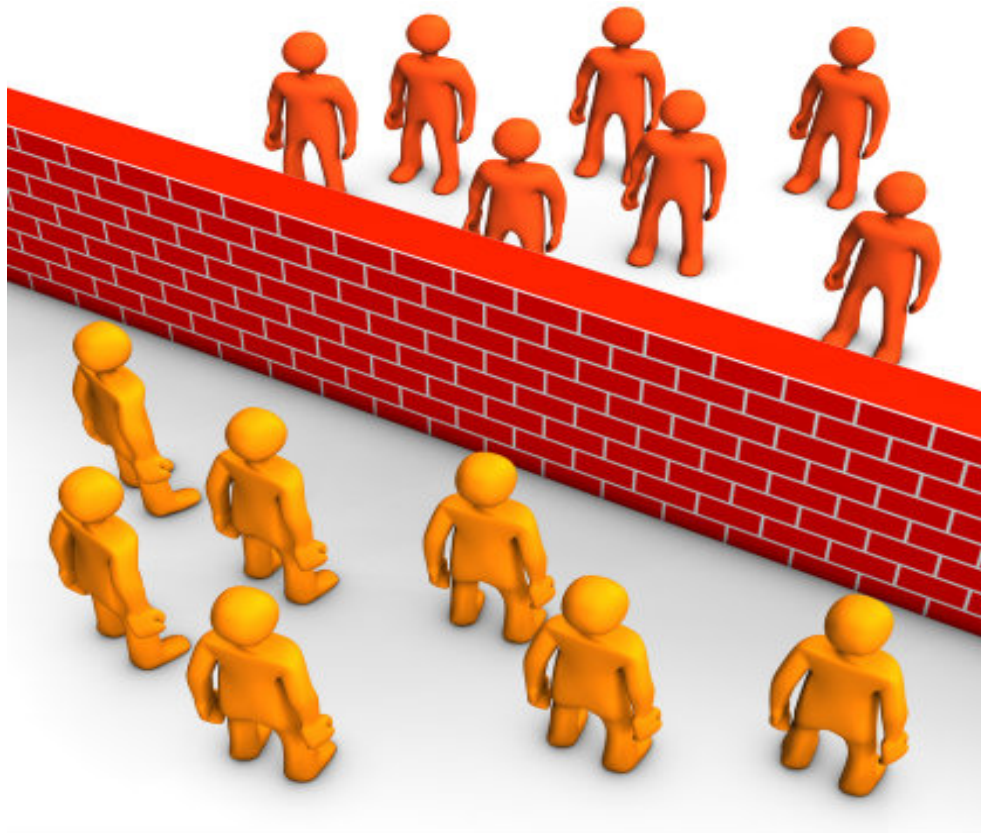


seize

(take by force) control?





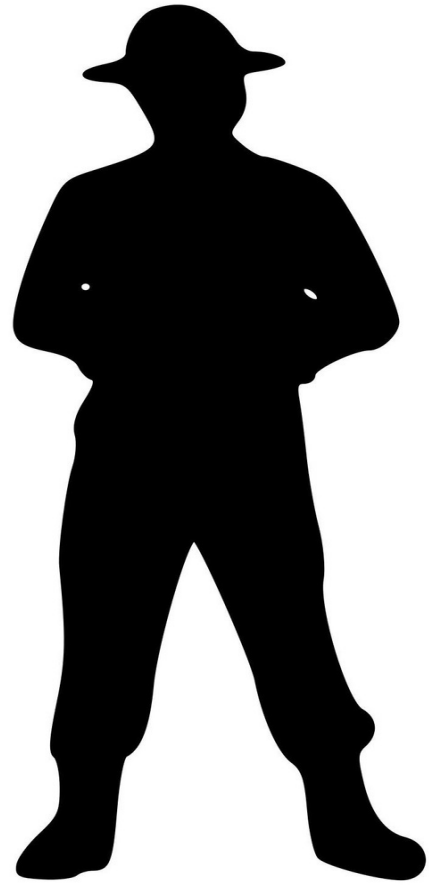
separate

than a corporal.



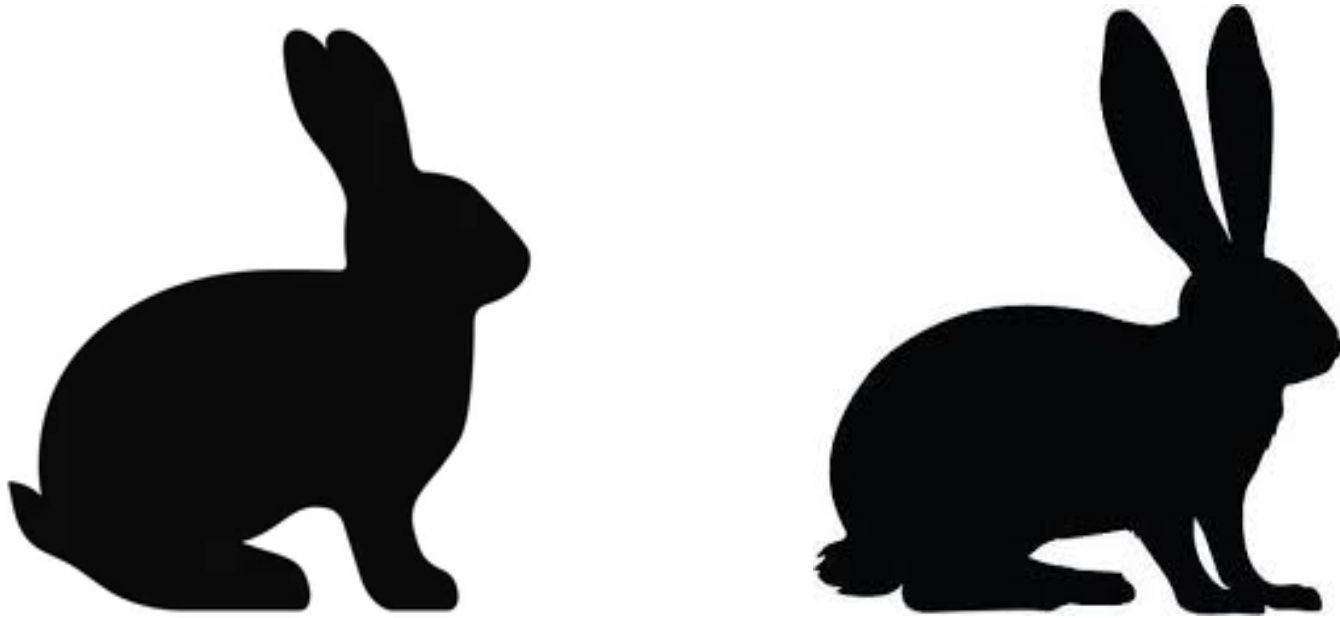


shenanigans

(*funny, humorous*).**

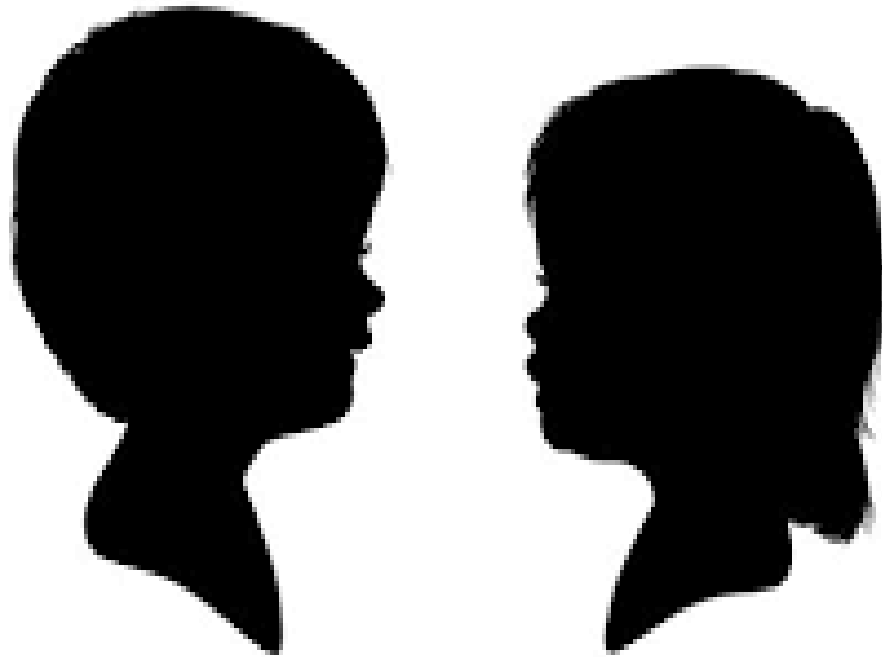


similar
