A wish sandwich is two pieces of bread and wishing there were something between the bread.




#404 scissors (noun)


The oldest known scissors date back to 1500 BC (Egypt).

Will they <u>seize</u> (take by force) control?






separate

ranks higher than a corporal.








shenanigans

(noun) During recess, my students are always doing <u>shenanigans</u> (funny, humorous).




Similar
