


#51 one (adjective)

One can be a generic pronoun, usually used instead of you.




#52 two (adjective)


#53 three (adjective)

Why did you buy three shoes?











#54 four (adjective)

She has four dolls.






#55 five (adjective)

I have a friend with <u>five</u> legs; his pants fit like a glove.








He has six oranges.





She has seven apples.




