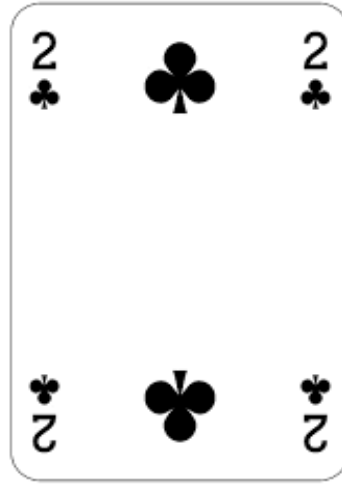
#51 **one** (adjective)

(pronoun) Two of my classmates are absent.

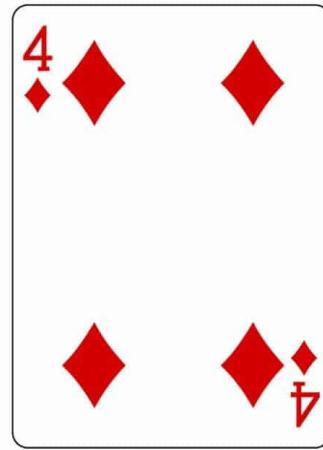

three shoes?**

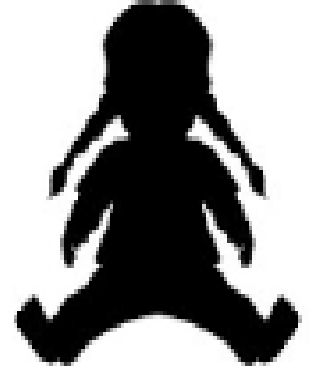
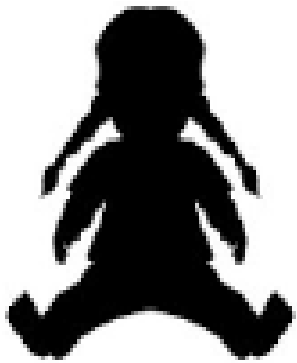


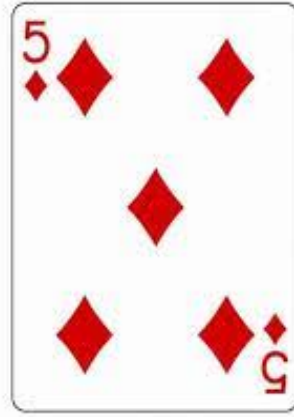

She has four dolls.



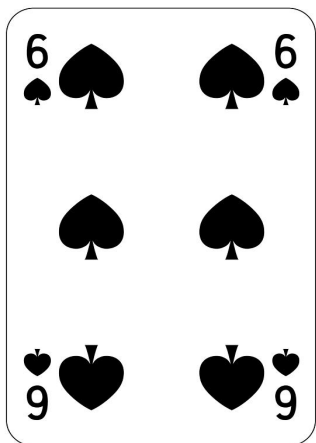

his pants fit like a glove.



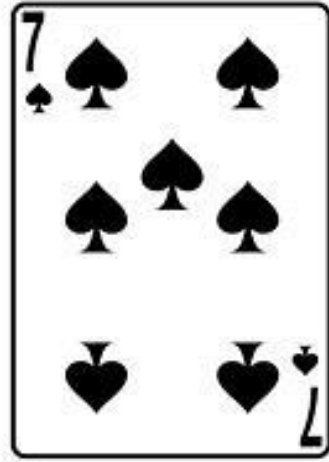

He has six oranges.



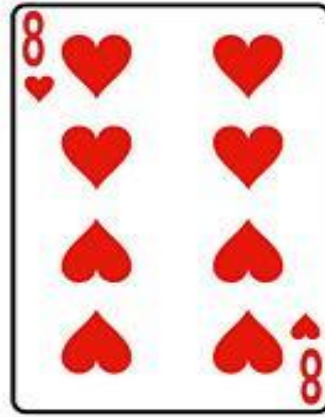

She has seven apples.



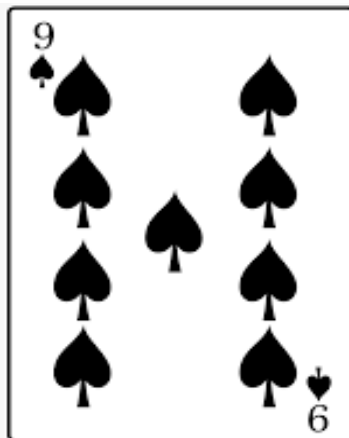

We have eight pencils.





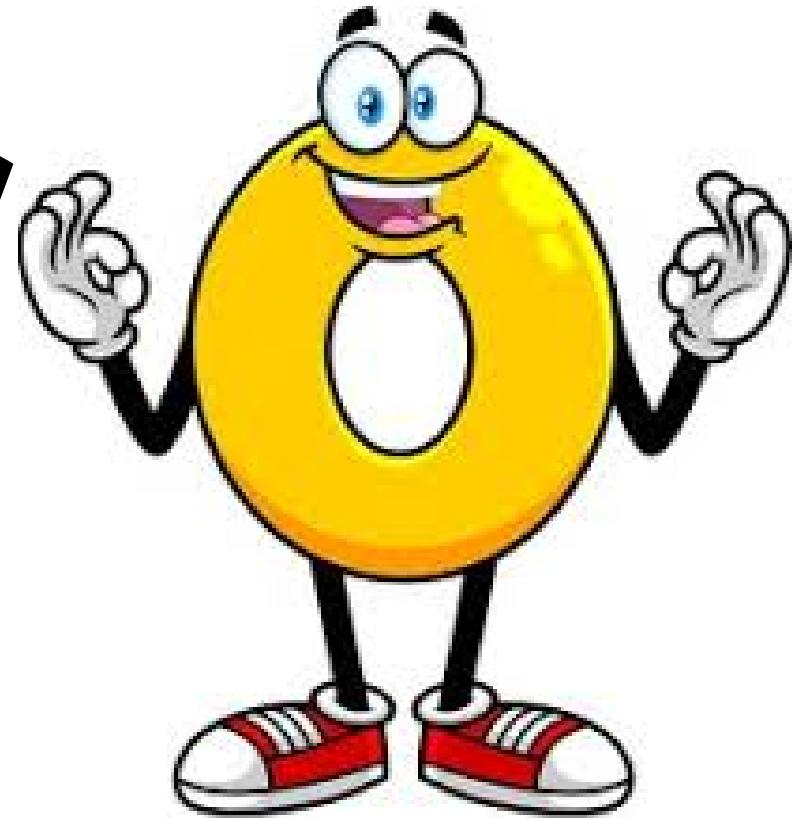
