


#71 first (adjective)

#73 to (preposition)

Let's go to the movies.



Has many definitions, such as direction, purpose, etc. Can be other parts of speech.

#74 from (preposition)

I am home from (a starting point) School.





#75 only (adjective)

This is the only crayon I have.




(adverb) The tickets are only available online.

Has many definitions and can be a conjunction.

#76 both (adjective)

Drive with both

(two people or things)
hands on the
steering wheel.





#77 right (adjective)

Is this the right (correct) tool for the job?




(adjective) Most people write with their right hand.

(noun) You have the <u>right</u> (legal entitlement) to remain silent.



#78 left (adjective)

About ten percent of people write with their left hand.



(adverb) Turn left (direction) at the stop sign.


(verb) We left (depart) him at home.
