#431 accentuate (verb) /ek sench ū āte/

The makeup accentuates

(to make more noticeable) her cheekbones.





accommodate

#432 accommodate (verb) /u kom u date/

The movie theatre can accommodate

(to allow or make room for without crowding)

over 100 people.



acquaintance

#433 acquaintance (noun) /u kwayn tense/

We are not close friends, but he is an acquaintance



(to casually know someone).






#434 acre (noun) /a ker/

An American football field is just over an <u>acre</u>

(43,560 square feet of land).





adamant

#435 adamant (adjective) /ad u ment/

He is adamant (will not change opinion or mind) that teaching sight words must be done.



#436 ad lib (adverb, no hyphen)

Homework can be given to the students <u>ad lib</u> (without restriction).

Other uses of <u>ad-lib</u> (spontaneous, without preparation) need a hyphen.

(adjective) He gave an ad-lib speech.

(verb) She had to ad-lib because she lost her notes.

(noun) Did you plan it, or was it an ad-lib?




advocate

#437 advocate (verb) /ad vu k āte/

My teacher <u>advocates</u>
(a person who supports something)
the teaching of irregular verbs.

(noun) /ad vu ket/
I am an
advocate
of hard work.






affidavit

#438 affidavit (noun) /a fi dāy vit/

His lawyer had him sign an <u>affidavit</u>

(a written statement of facts that by law you promise to be true).






aggravate

#439 aggravate (verb) /ah gru vāte/

Raising your voice will only aggravate (to make something worse) the situation.





amicable

#440 amicable (adjective) /amikubul/

They have an <u>amicable</u> (friendly, peaceful) relationship.
