

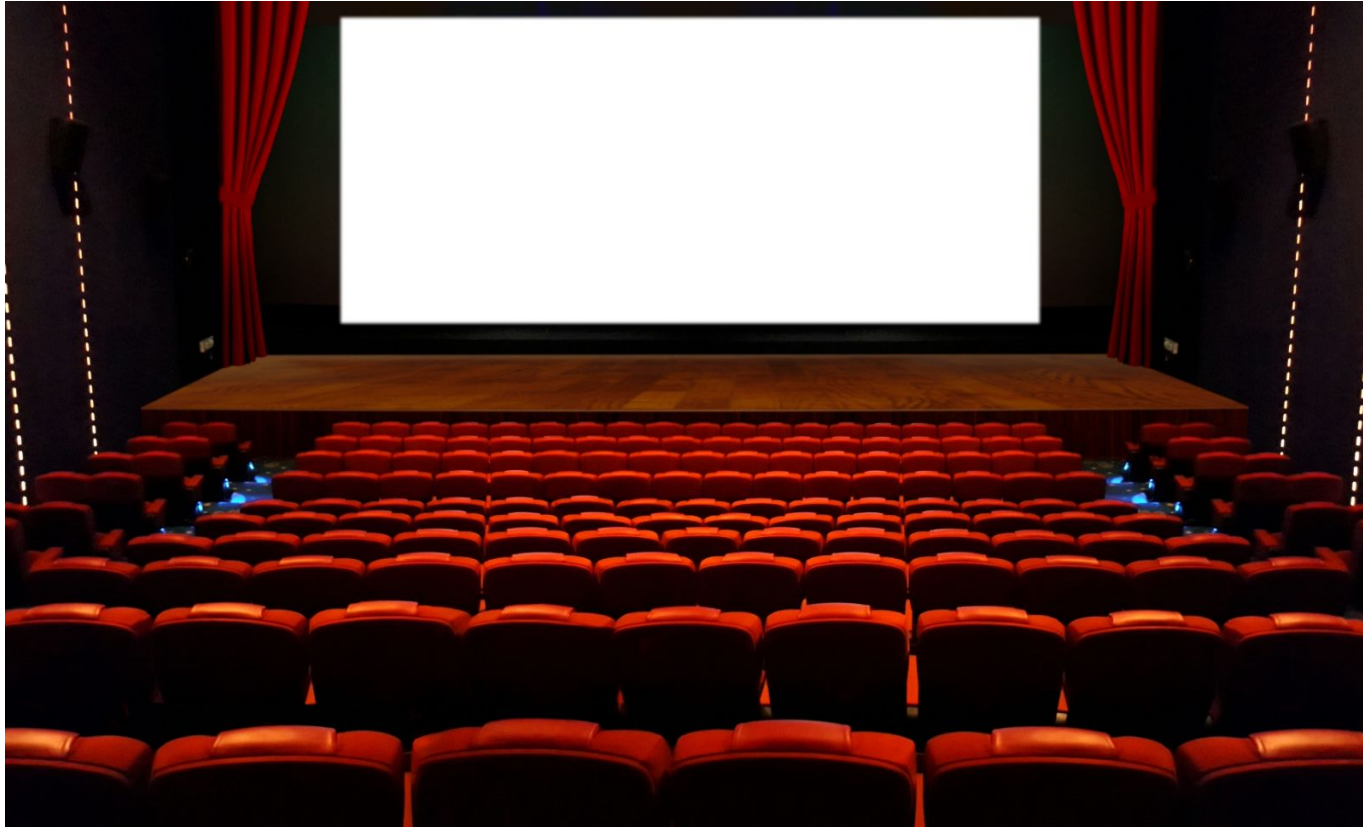


accentuate

her cheekbones.





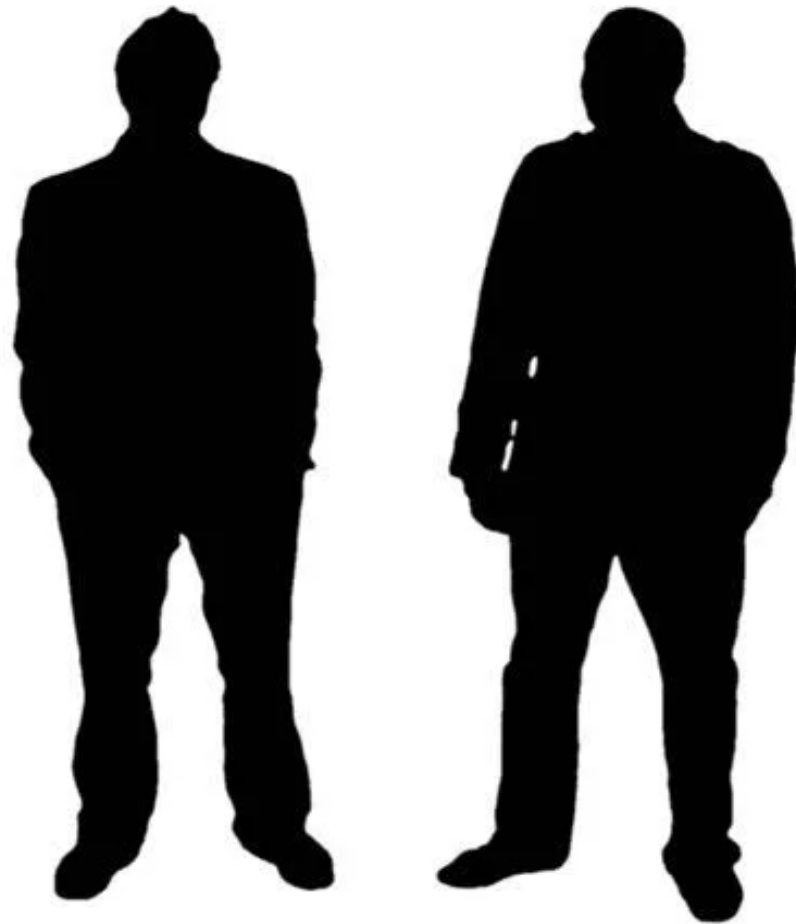
accommodate

#432 accommodate (verb) /u kom u dāte/

**The movie theatre can
accommodate**

(to allow or make room for without crowding)

over 100 people.



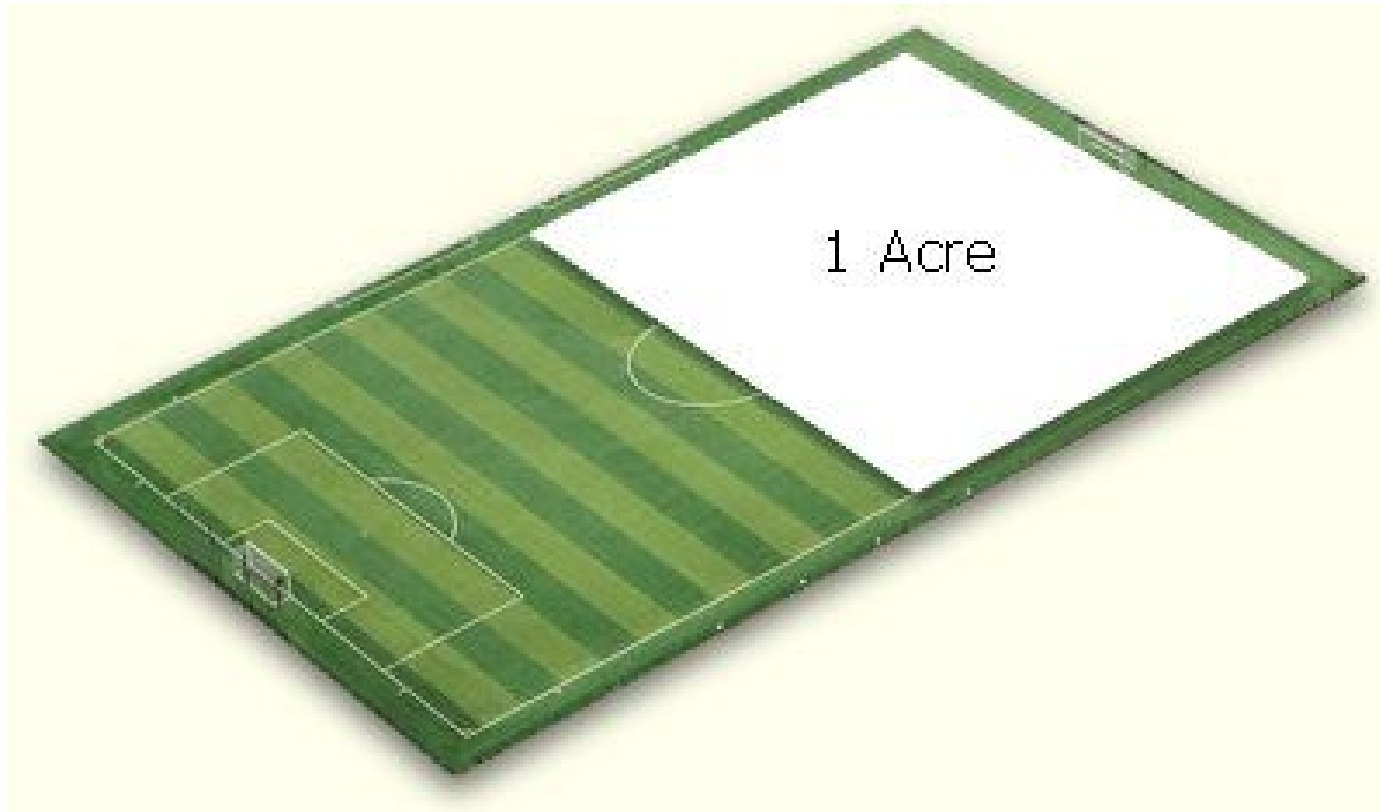
acquaintance

#433 acquaintance (noun) /u kwāyn tense/

**We are not
close friends,
but he is an
acquaintance**



(to casually know someone).

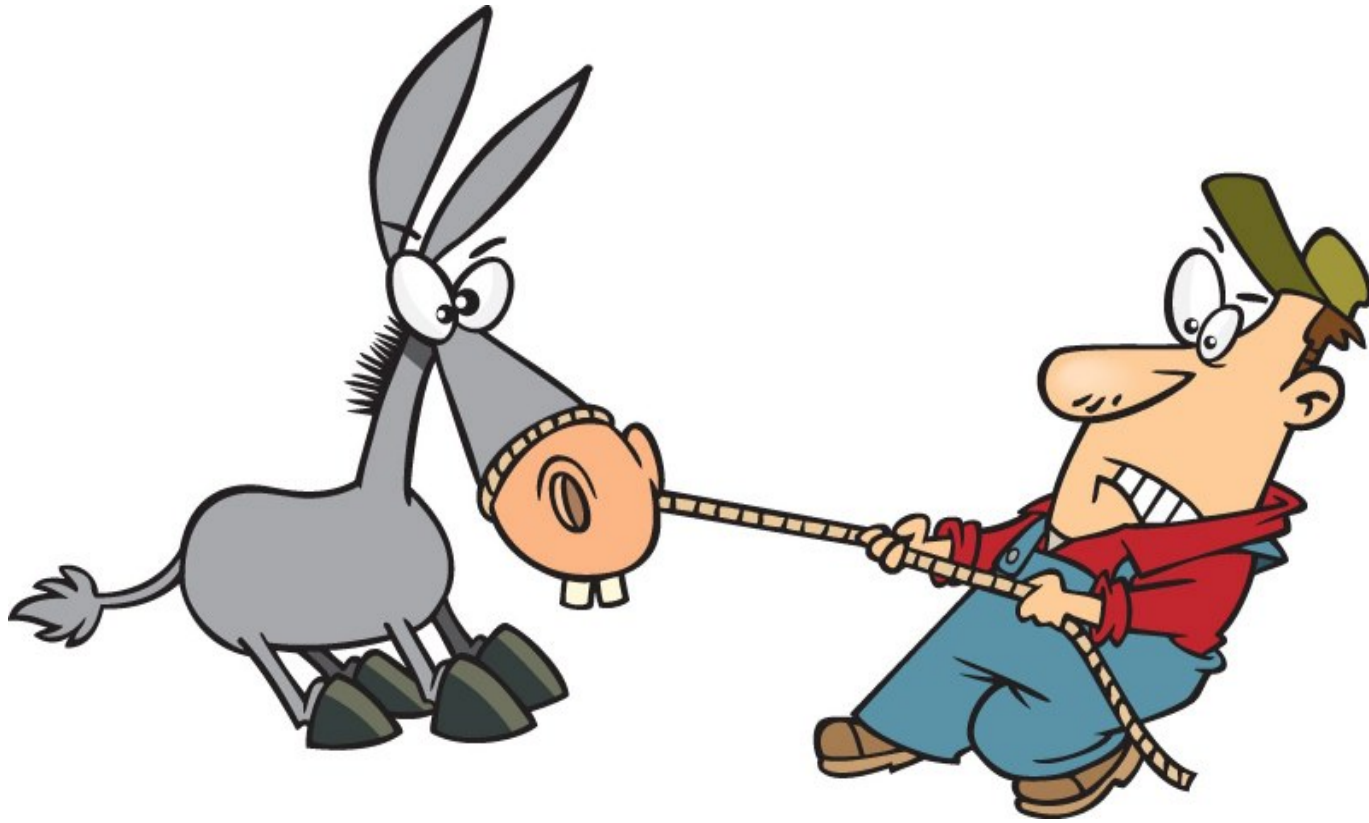


acre

#434 **acre** (noun) /ā ker/

An American football field is just over an acre
(43,560 square feet of land).





adamant

#435 **adamant** (adjective) /ad u ment/

He is adamant

*(will not change
opinion or mind)*

that teaching
sight words
must be done.



ad-lib

ad lib

#436 **ad lib** (adverb, no hyphen)

Homework can be given to the students ad lib
(*without restriction*).

Other uses of ad-lib (*spontaneous, without preparation*) need a hyphen.

(adjective) He gave an ad-lib speech.

(verb) She had to ad-lib because she lost her notes.

(noun) Did you plan it, or was it an ad-lib?



advocate

#437 advocate (verb) /ad vu k āte/

My teacher advocates

(a person who supports something)

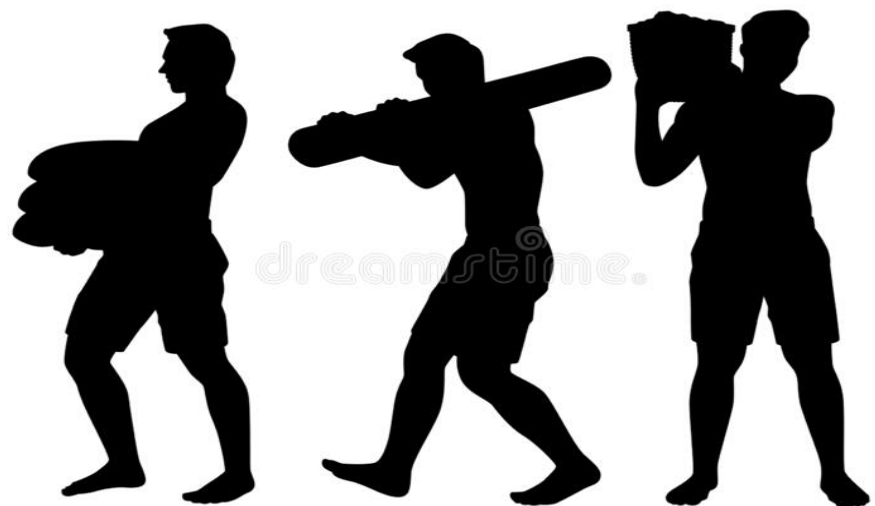
the teaching of irregular verbs.

of hard work.





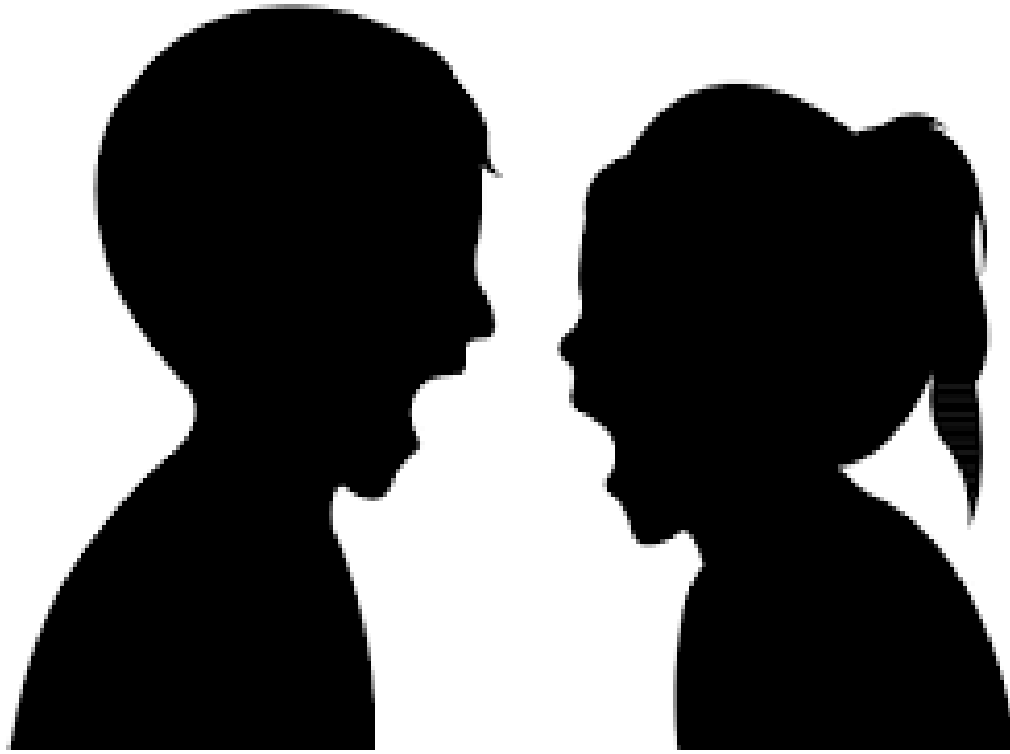
affidavit

#438 affidavit (noun) /a fi dāy vit/

an affidavit**

*(a written statement of facts that by
law you promise to be true).*

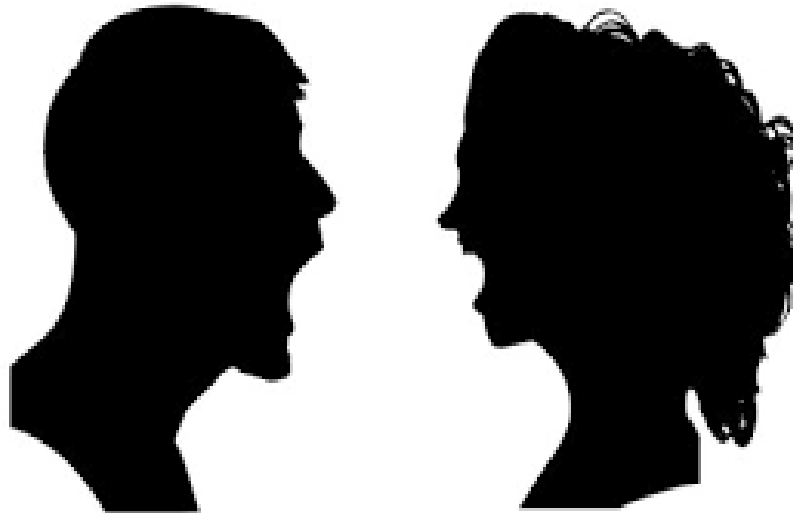




aggravate

#439 **aggravate** (verb) /ah gru vāte/

Raising your voice will
only aggravate (*to make
something worse*) the situation.





amicable

#440 amicable (adjective) /am i ku bul/

They have an amicable
(friendly, peaceful) relationship.
