





SUBJECT PRONOUN

I need help.

YOU You need help.

HE He needs help.

SHE She needs help.

IT It needs help.

WE we need help.

THEY They need help.

OBJECT PRONOUN

ME Can you help me?

YOU Can I help you?

HIM Can you help him?

HER Can you help her?

Can you help it?

US Can you help us?

THEM Can you help them?

We usually use a S+V+O.

^{*} You and it are both subject and object pronouns.
