






## They said, "Help, I was in a hurricane!"

Depending on their location in the ocean, a storm can be a hurricane (Atlantic/Northeast Pacific), a cyclone (Southwest Pacific/Indian) or a typhoon (Northwest Pacific).



Yes, a hurricane could become a typhoon.

Monsoon- heavy rain in SE Asia (May to September). Tropical Depression- winds up to 38 mph. Tropical Storm- winds from 39 to 73 mph. Hurricane, Cyclone & Typhoon- winds, 74 mph+.
