## BLIZZARD


### Definition

For 3 hours or longer:


- Sustained wind or frequent gusts to 35 mph or more
- Considerable falling and/or blowing snow (reducing visibility to less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile)








They said, "Help,

Depending on their location in the ocean, a storm can be a hurricane (Atlantic/Northeast Pacific), a cyclone (Southwest Pacific/Indian) or a typhoon (Northwest Pacific).



Yes, a hurricane could become a typhoon.

Monsoon- heavy rain in SE Asia (May to September).

Tropical Depression- winds up to 38 mph.

Tropical Storm- winds from 39 to 73 mph.

Hurricane, Cyclone & Typhoon- winds, 74 mph+.
