Infinitive Marker + Verb

An infinitive is a verb that functions as a different part of speech (noun, adjective & adverb).

How to find the infinitive?

```
To + a verb = an infinitive.
"It is easy to find the infinitive."
```

To + a noun = a prepositional phrase. "We are going to the movies."






