(present) pull (past) pulled (past participle) pulled



Present tense/Base form Shall I help him pull his car?

Simple past <u>Last time I pulled a car, my</u> <u>legs were sore for three days.</u>

Past participle (add a helping verb) <u>I don't think</u> he has ever pulled a car before!

Adverbs, such as ever, just, etc., can be placed between the helping verb and main verb.

Present participle (pulling) <u>Is he tired of pulling</u> his car?

3rd person, present singular (pulls) No, he pulls his

car to work every day.

Infinitive (to pull) Maybe tomorrow, you

should try to pull your car.
