3rd person, present singular (shrinks) You know a
sweater shrinks in the dryer.

Past participle (add a helping verb) <u>The dryer</u>
<u>could have shrunk it even more!</u>

Present participle (shrinking) <u>You are always</u>
<u>shrinking my sweaters!</u>

3rd person, present singular (shrinks) <u>You know a</u>

sweater shrinks in the dryer.

Infinitive (to shrink) I think she makes it a point to shrink my sweaters.
