The Futility of Inappropriate Counselling (continued)

Some Lessons

- * The friends' addresses continue without adding anything new; Eliphaz does best, but Bildad and Zophar fade out; we often withdraw when the perplexities of Christian situations defeat us
- * Neither our Lord nor the friends convince Job of sin; Job admits sinfulness, but acquits himself of specific wrongs
- * Since Jehovah will not answer him, and Job is not suffering because of sin, what he pleads for is care and sympathy
- * Job finds some comfort in counting past blessings, but becomes bitter and closes down

Key Themes and Representative Verses

- * Eliphaz II (Ch 15) more of the same: Job is a hypocrite (15: 5), everyone is a sinner (15: 15), sin brings suffering (15: 34)
- * Job V (Chs 16-17) bad counselling generates hostility (16: 1), his conscience is clear (16: 19-20), and he expects only Sheol for them all (17: 16)
- * Bildad II (Ch. 18) sin brings punishment (18: 5)
- * Job VI (Ch. 19) thinks everybody has failed him: friends, relatives, servants, for all he wants from them is sympathy (19: 21); however, God will vindicate him in the end (19: 25)
- * Zophar II (Ch. 20) reiterates in detail and unsympathetically many possible punishments for sin (20: 29)
- * Job VII (Ch. 21) the prosperity of the wicked disproves the friends' arguments (21: 7)
- * Eliphaz III (Ch. 22) renews the evangelistic appeal (22: 21-23)
- * Job VIII (Chs. 23-24) pleads for divine fellowship (23: 3), reiterates his faith (23: 10), and points out afresh that sin does not always bring retribution in this life (24: 19)
- * Bildad III (Ch. 25) all have sinned (25: 5-6)
- * Job IX (Chs. 27-31) restates his righteousness and refuses hypocrisy (27: 8), becomes poetical and affirms his abiding trust in Jehovah come what may (28: 28), rejoices in the the glories of his past (29: 14), laments his humiliation (30: 19-20), accuses himself of everything he can think of and acquits himself, and, if our Lord will not answer him leaves things at that (31: 35)
