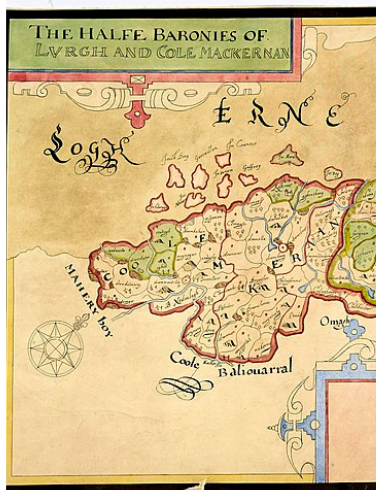

The townland, often with different and inconsistent spellings, is unique to Ireland and is a key feature of helping to tie down where your Irish ancestor came from. To confuse matters there are often townlands of the same name in different parts of the country, sometimes even in the same county; there are also civil and ecclesiastical parishes, both Church of Ireland and Roman Catholic. How do you identify the correct one and pinpoint their location? Understanding records used for land administrative divisions that include Townlands, Parishes, Baronies, Poor Law Unions and District Electoral Divisions is essential for your Irish ancestor research.

Natalie is a full-time professional genealogist, educator and author who undertakes ancestral research throughout the UK and Ireland, specialising in Irish and Scots-Irish genealogy research. She is a frequent speaker on the local, national and international circuits on Irish genealogy topics and delivers regular genealogy courses with a focus on Irish records.

A native of County Antrim, her company Roots Revealed is based in Ballymena, County Antrim, Northern Ireland. She has a Post Graduate Certificate in Genealogical Studies from the University of Strathclyde, because she has built upon many years of Irish family history research experience.
